TODAY'S MASS

First Reading (Acts 10:25-26.34-35. 44-48): At the house of the centurion Cornelius St Peter comes to realise that the gift of faith is open to Gentiles as well as Jews. This is confirmed by the descent of the Holy Spirit upon everyone.

Psalm (Ps 97:1-4. R.v2): The message of this psalm is summarised in the refrain: 'The Lord has shown his salvation to the nations'.


Second Reading (1 Jn 4:7-10): The most profound statement is contained in this reading: God is love. This is not a metaphor or simile, it is what God is. And John teaches us that love is primarily and originally God's love, revealed in the person of Jesus.

Gospel (Jn 15:9-17): The great commandment is 'Love one another as I have loved you', so important a message that it is repeated several times in this short extract. The disciples are Jesus' friends because He has taught them everything that comes from the Father - they have been 'let into the secret' - and because they do what Jesus has commanded them to do. And the proof that there is true friendship and love is to be found in the fruitful lives of the disciples.

After Ordination priests serve Christ and His people in parishes, hospitals, schools, chaplaincies and prisons. It costs £30,000 per annum for each seminarian, and they study for 6 years before Ordination. THURSDAY: SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

This Solemnity is a Holyday of Obligation, that is a day when all Catholics should attend Holy Mass if at all possible.

The Vigil Mass will be at 6.30pm on Wednesday (which has its own Mass texts but the same readings as the Mass of the Day), and on Thursday at 9.00am in Sacred Heart School, and at 10.00am (attended by Donhead School), 6.30pm and 8.00pm in Church.

This great Solemnity celebrates the glorification of Jesus Christ as He takes His seat at the right hand of the Father, 40 days after Easter. Christ's Ascension is described in the First Reading, taken from the beginning of The Acts of the Apostles, and in the Gospel, taken from the end of Mark's Gospel, and it makes sense of the Psalm, a joyful song for the Ascension.

FRIDAY: HOLY SPIRIT NOVENA

The Novena to the Holy Spirit for the reunion of Christendom begins on Friday. A Novena is nine days of prayer, derived from the nine days of prayer, between the Ascension and Pentecost, of the disciples in the upper room (Acts 1: 12 - 2:5).

CHARLES THIRU RIP

Funeral Mass at 12.00noon on Friday, followed by Burial at the Morden and Sutton Cemetery.

There will be no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday morning.

BISHOPS' REFLECTION ON GENDER

The Bishops of England & Wales have issued a pastoral reflection on gender, highlighting the teaching of the Church but also stressing that accompanying those struggling with gender dysphoria is a "complex but essential task". The document, titled *Intricately woven by the Lord: A pastoral reflection on gender by the bishops of England and Wales*, emphasises that all are welcome in the Church, but says that the sexual identity of an individual is not a purely "cultural or social construction."
