A Tale of two Souls

Today's gospel presents us with a tale of two souls who knew each other in life but ended up in two completely situations.

The fact of one being rich and the other poor is incidental compared with their relationship with God.

Jesus in relating the parable of Lazarus and the rich man, wants to illustrate the point that the perspective on life we adopt during our time on earth we take with us into eternity. Jesus, once again, emphasises the danger of wealth, not as an evil in itself - wealth can be used for good after all - but as a means for self-indulgence: it is in the extravagance and the luxury of the rich man's life that he becomes fatally blinded to the danger of spiritual atrophy.

Indulgence in luxury when taking the form of gluttony, produces a desensitization of the spirit in the rich man. He becomes unable to love at very basic level; to love your neighbour as yourself which is an act of justice in the natural order. We note that the rich man does not end up in Hades for having committed murder, or adultery or stealing which are sins of commission, but for the sin of omission: because of a way of living centred entirely on self, with no reference to God or the other: he is unfaithful to his very nature as a person, a human being whose purpose is to be in relationship and consider the good of the other.

To indulge pleasure to such a degree induces a spiritual blindness in the rich man to the extent that he no longer sees the plight of the poor man Lazarus; he is incapable of empathising with his plight, let alone try to alleviate his suffering by giving him something to eat: he just doesn't see him.

The pride of riches and their possession, and the indulgence to excess in pleasuring the senses has robbed the rich man of the natural ability to seek the good of the other by giving of himself, and some of his own substance, to alleviate the suffering in the other. The greatest spiritual enrichment we can hope for is to give of ourselves, because by giving we attain to spiritual freedom and union with God by seeing and serving Christ in our neighbour. Indeed, in offering us the model of Lazarus Jesus is asking us to see in the despised, marginalised and dejected a model of Himself.

By contrast with the rich man Lazarus has no choice but to look beyond the goods of this world to spiritual goods. Poverty is deprivation, but paradoxically, it broadens the perspective of one who suffers it by considering God and a life beyond this earthly existence as their ultimate good. To desire that good is wisdom which ultimately leads to union with God in eternity.

The greatest good we possess in this life is the spiritual ability to love, and to perform the works of love; the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy that Jesus requires of us his disciple in the gospels. In the short time we have on earth, these works are the means Jesus offers us for growth into true and lasting happiness, both in this world and eternal union with God in the next.
