Seeds

Chapter 13 of the Gospel according to Matthew recounts eight parables told by Jesus, drawn from scenes from everyday life in Palestine at that time ('the parables discourse'). The first, of the sower and the seeds (Mt 13:1-23), this Sunday's familiar Gospel reading, follows the indifference, rejection and sometimes hostility, that Jesus had in places met when preaching 'the word of the kingdom' (of God), particularly from the Pharisees.

A parable has been usefully defined (by the biblical scholar C.H Dodd) as 'a metaphor or a simile drawn from nature or common life, arresting the hearer by its vividness or strangeness, and leaving the mind in sufficient doubt of its application to tease it into active thought'.

The disciples ask Jesus why he talks to the crowd in parables but to them, the disciples, plainly. His reply is that the mysteries of the kingdom are already revealed to the disciples but not to the crowd, who 'look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding'; a crowd who fulfil Isaiah's prophecy that 'the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear that they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart and be converted by me.' So, is speaking in parables intended to prevent them understanding the word? Are they being punished for closing their eyes and ears? Or is Jesus deliberately trying to stimulate their curiosity and attentiveness to what he is saying by speaking in parables? He says at the end of the parable 'Listen, anyone who has ears!'

When we hear or read the parable itself (vv. 4-8) or Jesus' allegorical explanation of it to his disciples (vv. 18-23), linking the types of the soil on which the seed falls to the disposition of the various hearers, we should reflect on how it applies to us, his present disciples. Is our faith superficial?

Is it precarious? Are we prone to distraction by cares of the world (for example excessive career ambition or too much sport or other entertainment) or the lure of riches, and so choked and fruitless? Or do we hear the word, understand it and live lives fruitful for others, producing a hundredfold?

WORLD DAY FOR **GRANDPARENTS**

On Sunday 23 July, the Church celebrates the 3rd World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly, established by Pope Francis: the observance is celebrated each year on the 4th Sunday of July, coinciding with the feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary's parents and Jesus' grandparents, Ss Joachim and Anne. According to Vatican News, the theme was chosen to be in tune with that of World Youth Day in Lisbon ('His mercy is from age to age', Lk 1:50): 'Mary arose and went with haste', taken from Luke's Gospel when Mary immediately goes to meet her elderly cousin Elizabeth after the Angel's annunciation. Thus, it is a theme that highlights the importance of dialogue between generations, which is fundamental for perceiving and contemplating God's merciful action on behalf of human beings.
