### **TODAY'S MASS**

The Readings for this last Sunday of the liturgical year can be found in the *Lectionary* after the 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday (Vol 1 p 729); the other texts in the *Missal*, however, are found with the Solemnities of the Lord (p 543).

**First Reading:** God may be a good shepherd, but a good shepherd is one who is also a judge: bad and weak sheep may be discarded so as to retain the good sheep.

Psalm: as you pray this psalm, pray to be among those who enter heaven at the Day of Judgement.

**Second Reading**: today's Preface at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer recalls the thesis of this passage, that by His death on the cross Christ conquered death, that His resurrection precedes the resurrection of the faithful, and that this will be a cosmic transformation of the universe, in which all things will be subject to Him.

**Gospel**: in this Year of Matthew (Year A) the *Gospel* focuses on Christ as the Judge on the last day. And we shall be judged not so much on the sins we have committed (adultery, dishonesty, and so on) but on the good deeds for the poor and needy we have failed to do (welcoming the stranger, visiting the sick, etc).

We were anointed with the Oil of Chrism at our Baptism, as priest, prophet, and king. The better we understand the Feast of Christ the King the better we shall understand our own vocation.

## HOLY COMMUNION AT THE SUNDAY 10.00am MASS

To avoid gridlock at Holy Communion, please observe the following:

 do not join the Communion Procession too soon; in particular, if you are seated at sides, please wait patiently before joining the queue and do not let the queue go back beyond the back pew in the centre aisle. What is happening now is that everyone immediately rises and stands, in the side aisles as well as the central aisle, and this blocks those have received Communion from returning, thus causing the gridlock.

- use all four Ministers of Holy Communion: when you near the Altar look to see which Minister is free and go straight to them.

Thank you. This will most likely apply to many of the Christmas Masses as well.
