For many are called but few are chosen

remember once sitting in a restaurant with a friend and being totally distracted by a couple at the next table. Both were on their mobile phones while talking not saying a word to each other. The fascinating thing was that this went on for most of the meal. I suppose we shouldn't be that surprised, as we see half the people walking down the street, talking away happily to themselves. You could in a real sense say that we live in an age when many are called! As to whether few are chosen that is another business. The



readings today hang together around the motif of a banquet. In the first reading we have the image of heaven presented as a meal, great а celebration of our salvation and redemption. It is not surprising that this text is often used at funeral masses. The meal in Jesus' parable today is based also on an invitation, but one made to the Pharisees

and lawyers . It is they who reject the invitation to the meal, it is they who attack the messengers of God, it is they who are turned away from the kingdom. It is the marginalised, the least in the kingdom to whom the invitation is given, but even here not all who make it to the banquet are saved as we see in the treatment of the one without the festive garments. Many are called, as lesus says, but few are chosen. It is challenging а position for all of us. We are the inheritors of the invitation we need to be prepared.
