The middle Sunday of Lent is traditionally called Laetare Sunday, or Rejoice Sunday. It takes its name from the Latin word for rejoice which is the first word of the entry antiphon for this Sunday. Traditionally, it was the day when the rigours of Lent could be eased just for lt is day. insignificant that it is also 'Mothering Sunday' The day we think and thank our mums for all they have done for us



and continue to do for us. Mothering Sunday had its foundation in the celebration of the annunciation of our Blessed Lady. As with everything else, it has
