

Yet again, we begin that sorrowful journey through the events of Holy Week to the suffering and death of lesus and to glorious resurrection on Easter Day. The liturgies of this week are unique in the Church. They enable us to share in the events of lesus entry into Jerusalem. We sit with Jesus and his apostles at the last supper and share in both the institution of the Holy Eucharist and



the first ordinations. We share in the washing of the feet, Jesus' great sign of love gives that us the of context the Eucharist. On Good Friday we walk the way to tears to the summit

of Calvary and here witness the final suffering and sacrificial death of Jesus on the cross. The emptiness of Holy Saturday is reflected in the simple times of prayer and the preparation for joyous celebration of the Easter Vigil with the blessing of the fire, singing of the Exultet and the vigil of readings before the triumphant Alleluia proclaims the news of the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
