Last Sunday we woke up at the news of the strike on Syria. We may have thought a war imminent and we may have felt gloomy about the world future.

The gospel today tells us we need not fear. A good shepherd will lead us through difficult times: Jesus Christ. He leads us not for personal gain, but because he loves us and knows us. And this is mutual: the good shepherd loves the sheep and the sheep love him.

You may ask, how about who those do not recognise Jesus as their shepherd good decide not to follow him? Well, the gospel tells us Jesus' mission is to love and lead the sheep who are not of his fold. No
