The Ascension of the Lord

Thursday this week is of the feast the Ascension of our Lord into Heaven. With this great act the physical presence of Jesus Christ on earth ends, but not his spiritual presence. As he said to his apostles, "I will be with you always until the end of time." His presence with apostles and with all who have followed them, is through the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Blessed Trinity. Only when Jesus has returned

to His Father in heaven can he send the Holy Spirit into the lives of the Apostles when they then can find the courage to begin to preach the Good News of our salvation to the world. lesus has prepared apostles

well for the coming of the Spirit. His homily to them at the last supper, part of which we read today in the gospel, sets the scene for the coming of the Spirit, the Advocate. In his time with the apostles after the resurrection he further builds up their faith and confirms them in their role as his Apostles. Now in the days leading to Pentecost they have time to reflect on the significance of the Ascension of Jesus.
