# The Adoration of the Kings

The great feast of the Epiphany has in modern times been eclipsed by the feast of Christmas. In the feast of Christmas we have the nativity of the Lord lesus, his presence among us as God made Man. Born of Mary, the intimacy of his incarnation is shared with the shepherds from the fields. The intimacy of that scene now takes on universal significance in the arrival of the three Wise Men. Their adoration of the born child n e w acknowledges lesus as the Universal King. The gifts of the kings signify the kingship of Jesus in the gift of the gold, his divinity in the frankincense and his sacrifice on the cross in the gift of the myrrh. The kings themselves represent the and men women who throughout the ages acknowledge the reality of the new born child in



Bethlehem. Here in the arms of Mary is the Messiah, the Emmanuel, the Saviour of the world. His presentation to the world is the significance of the feast today which we celebrate in our liturgy.

We will celebrate socially next weekend when we have our annual Epiphany Party. All are welcome to join us from 7.30pm onwards in the Upper Hall when we will have a barn dance and light supper. It is a free evening so do come along and enjoy the event.
