

Jesus calls for a change of heart

To follow God and speak in his name presumes that we are ready to keep the commandments. In fact Sirach insists that God has given no one permission to sin. This should remind us of advice from lesus that sometimes sounds strange to our ears, 'If your right eye should cause you to sin, tear it out and throw it away...' He is speaking in an exaggerated way to get our attention; clearly, he does not intend these words to be taken literally. The image of tearing out our right eye links back to his understanding of adultery-not just as a physical act but as an intention or desire of the heart: 'whoever looks at a woman lustfully ...' Jesus goes beyond the actions prohibited by the Ten Commandments to the roots of those actions in the human God.



heart. This is the 'deeper' virtue he referred to a few verses earlier. But here is a major insight: Jesus calls for not just a change of behaviour but a change of heart, a purifying of desire and intention. We must strive to be sincere in our effort to follow Jesus.

St. Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians (2:6-10) understood this personal change to be the work of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who renews the human heart. It is above all in prayer that we open ourselves to the Spirit of
