





Requiem Mass

One of the great sadness at this time is the number of families who first are not permitted to be with a loved one as they face the final hours of life, and when they do die they are severely limited as to how many may attend the funeral service. We are able to offer, through streaming, to hold a Requiem Mass on the day of the funeral which can be accessed by family and friends. The celebrant would say the regular 10am Mass alone in the church and it would be a Requiem Mass for the deceased. The internment would then take place later in the day. If you would like to make use of this facility please talk to the priest preparing the funeral with you.
