TIMES OF SERVICES DURING THE WEEK:

Mass will be celebrated each day at 10am and 6:30pm from Monday to Saturday. Masses on Sunday will be at 6:30pm Saturday and Sunday at 10am, 12noon, 5pm and 8pm. Confessions will be on Saturdays at 10:30am to 11:30am and 3:30 to 4:00pm

REINSTATING THE 6:30pm MASS:

We have now reinstated the 6:30pm Mass each evening Monday to Saturday. The Mass is open to all parishioners. Everyone from our parish community is welcome at this mass and it will be in accordance with our normal Sunday and weekday safety protocols

The church will be open for private devotions **Monday to Friday from 11am to 2:00pm** unless there is a funeral Because of the weddings and baptisms there will be no exposition and private prayer on Saturday and Sunday, though the church will be open for confessions, and services.

Please remember that numbers of guests at funerals are limited to 30 and 15 for weddings. So, unless invited by the family to attend the service please do not attend funeral services. The services are normally streamed.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR VISITING THE CHURCH DURING COVID

Since this Saturday morning, the London Borough of Merton and hence the parish, now fall within the government's 'Local Covid Alert Level – High'. Fortunately, this does not change the arrangements for places of worship. I would however ask all those attending Mass to follow the stewards' instructions on entering the church and in particular to wait in their pews to be invited to go up to receive Holy Communion. It is very important for all that we observe social distancing whilst queuing to receive.

May I remind you that face coverings must now be worn in places of worship whenever you visit. The stewards do have spare masks available at the back of the church if you have forgotten to bring one with you today. Thank you for your co-operation.

During the week Mass will be said for 72 people each day at 10am and at 6:30pm on Monday and Friday. If numbers require, we will increase the number of masses both on Sundays and weekdays.

We have arranged for an overflow of parishioners to join a streamed Mass in the upper hall when Holy Communion can also be received. With the numbers at the 10 am Sunday Mass increasing, please be prepared to be directed to the upper hall if asked to do so by the stewards.

The collection will not take place during the Mass. There are two contactless card readers at the back of the church and we encourage you to use those to make your weekly offering if you are not doing so by standing order. You can make offerings from £1 upwards. You simply tap the amount you want to contribute and the touch your card on the reader. If you wish to register for Gift Aid, press the relevant button and register your details. You only need to register once. After that each contribution you make with that card will be paired with your Gift Aid Registration.

Alternatively, there is the facility to donate online through the parish website. As always, I must thank you all for your continued generosity at a time of restricted finances.

SCHOOL APPLICATION FORMS:

Applications forms for all Catholic Schools carry a paragraph needing a recommendation from the local parish priest supporting the application. Usually this would give me an opportunity to meet parents when they come along with their forms to get them signed. This year because of the threat of the virus I am unable to meet parents as I am in the category needing shielding.

We have considered different ways in which we can work around the problem of completing the forms without getting too close to the parents. Each school will distribute the application forms when requested. The forms, when completed by parents will be handed to the school by a set date identified by the school. After 72 hours the forms will be transferred to the presbytery for Canon John to sign. After completion of the signing of the forms by Canon John, they will be returned to the school. Two reminders only forms fully completed will be accepted by Canon John for signing and, no forms presented after the closing date advised by each school will be accepted for signing.

PARISH FLOWER GROUP

Lockdown came during Lent, a time in the churches year when flowers are not permitted in the church, except for Mothering Sunday, so a quiet time for our team of volunteers.

However, lockdown of the Church came just two days before Mothering Sunday and the flower group found itself with an immediate challenge. The speed of the lockdown meant that we found ourselves with 1000 fresh daffodils made into 200 bunches ready for the 9.45am Family Mass on 22nd March, which because of the restrictions was not going to be celebrated. We could not let the flowers go to waste. A couple of phone calls to the Sacred Heart School and we were able to deliver all the flowers to the school, for the children, just in time for their last day of school as lockdown began. We hope very much that the children and the parents enjoyed the flowers.

Easter came along and access to the church was still restricted to the clergy only. Again after a few phone calls a large vase of beautiful Easter Lilies were left at the door of the Sacristy for Canon John to place under the altar in time for the Easter celebrations, one of the may additional tasks he has had to undertake in lockdown.

As lockdown has eased and access to the church has increased, four of the team have been taking it in turn to provide fresh vases of flowers for the sanctuary, still limiting our time in the church and working alone to reduce risk. We are now working to bring more of our wonderful volunteers together, within the Covid guidelines, to help bring the beauty of flowers to the celebrations taking place in the church once again. UPDATE ON RE-OPENING THE PARISH HALLS

The Parish is now in a position to re-open the halls for activities that are permitted under the Government's COVID-19 restrictions, beginning with the Lower Hall and the Lounge. Our risk assessment has been approved by the Diocese and we have put in place a range of measures to make the halls "COVID-19 secure".

If you wish to use the halls you will need to make a booking by emailing <u>thelma@sacredheartwimbledon.org.uk</u> and ensure you comply with the parish risk assessment. Links to the checklists setting out what measures the parish is putting in place, and what measures event organisers will need to take is available on the <u>home page</u> of the parish website. Rule of Six: We have received several questions about how the rule of six will affect events in the parish halls. This depends on the type of event.

For social activities, the Government tightened up the guidance on 1 October. The Government guidance reads: "COVID-secure community facilities are permitted to hold social groups, clubs and activities in groups of no more than 6. Community facilities can host multiple groups of 6, subject to capacity, but groups must not mix socially or form larger groups. However, we strongly advise that activities where there is a significant likelihood of groups mixing and socialising (and where it will be difficult to prevent mingling and therefore breaking the law) should not take place in a community facility."

For **support groups**, "gatherings of groups of up to 15 (subject to capacity)" are permitted "if organised by a business, charitable, benevolent or philanthropic institution or a public body to provide mutual aid, therapy or any other form of support to its members or those who attend its meetings."

For **meetings**: Government guidance says "We continue to recommend that where meetings can take place digitally without the need for face-to-face contact, they should continue to do so."

Activities for **children and young people** are permitted, subject to specific guidance: <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/protective-measures-for-holiday-or-after-school-clubs-and-other-out-of-school-settings-for-children-during-the-coronavirus-covid-19-outbreak</u> and, for youth <u>https://nya.org.uk/guidance/</u>

Indoor performances to socially distanced audiences can take place if in line with the performing arts guidance: <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/working-safely-during-coronavirus-covid-19/performing-arts</u>. Community facilities must not allow singing in groups of more than 6, dancing, or music over certain volumes.

In all cases, users of COVID-19 secure facilities such as the parish halls should maintain social distancing between households and follow the familiar requirements regarding hand hygiene, face coverings and track and trace. Full details are set out in the parish risk-assessment.
