MESSAGE FROM CANON JOHN

In view of the continuing seriousness of the public health situation and the advice to stay at home, the church will not re-open for public masses this week. This is not a decision that we have taken lightly. I recognise the distress that this will cause and would urge all of you to see this as a limited period of sacrifice to protect the lives and the health of others. This decision will continue to be reviewed on a weekly basis.

Whilst we are unable to come together in person, we can still join together spiritually via the live-streamed Masses. Masses will be streamed daily through

Weekdays including Saturdays:	10am and 6.30pm

For those without internet access, the Diocese of Middlesbrough offers a Catholic Massby-phone service. To take part, call 01642 130120 (calls are charged at a local rate). The church will also continue to open for private prayer every weekday between 10.30am - 12 noon and for Reconciliation between 10.30-11.30am on Saturday morning.

Subject to a review of the latest situation regarding the virus towards the end of next week, it is our intention to re-open the church for public Masses on weekdays (Monday to Friday) from 1 February, with a range of additional safety measures in place.

An Act of Spiritual Communion can help us when we follow Mass online and ask for Our Lord's guidance by offering prayers like this one written by St. Alphonsus Liguori in the 18th century: My Jesus,

I believe that You are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. *Amen*

ARRANGEMENTS FOR VISITING THE CHURCH

Any time the church is open, there will be stewards on duty to ensure we observe the COVID-safety practices. Parishioners are asked to wear face masks when entering the church. Please bring your completed Track and Trace form with you. Alternatively, download the NHS COVID-19 app and scan it (scanning codes are on the pillars by the rear tables).

For everyone's safety, please follow the guidelines and be respectful of our stewards and their role in keeping the church open. Please keep a safe distance of 2 metre, use hand gel on entry and (unless exempt) wear a face mask.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

On the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, 8 December 2020, the Holy Father announced that a *Year of Saint Joseph* was to begin that same day to mark the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church by Blessed Pope Pius IX in 1870. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris Corde (With a Father's Heart)*, Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. The Holy Father wrote *Patris Corde* against the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of '*ordinary*' people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, '*the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence*' who nonetheless played '*an incomparable role in the history of salvation*'.
