

### **OPENING OF THE CHURCH**

The church is open to welcome you on weekdays for Mass at 10am and 6.30pm and from 10.30am - 12noon for private prayer.

Please note that on days when funeral Masses are celebrated at 11.30am, private prayer will close at 11.10am.

Sunday Masses will be the Vigil Mass on Saturday evening at 6.30pm and on Sunday Masses at 10am, 12noon, 5pm and 8pm.

Confessions are available on Saturdays 10.30 - 11.30pm and 6 - 6.20pm.

The Sunday obligation remains suspended, so some parishioners may prefer to attend a quieter weekday Mass than a Sunday Mass. Masses will also continue to be live-streamed daily through <a href="https://www.churchservices.tv/wimbledon">https://www.churchservices.tv/wimbledon</a> as follows: Sundays: 10am and 8pm Weekdays including Saturdays: 10am and 6.30pm

Unfortunately, the internet in the parish office is out of action which means that the priests and staff in the Presbytery do not have access to their terminals and cannot communicate by email; also, the streaming of Masses is suspended. This is a local issue and not the responsibility of Churchservices.

It may be some days before all facilities are restored but we are hoping to provide the streaming for Masses on a temporary basis.

Thelma D'Costa will be able to pick up emails through her mobile phone but our ability to respond will be very limited.

For those without internet access, the Diocese of Middlesbrough offers a Catholic mass-by-phone service. To take part, call 01642 130120 (calls are charged at a local rate).

### ARRANGEMENTS FOR VISITING THE CHURCH

Any time the church is open, there will be stewards on duty to ensure we observe the COVID-safety practices. Parishioners are asked to wear face masks (unless exempt) and use hand gel when entering the church. Please bring your completed Track and Trace form with you. Alternatively, download the NHS COVID-19 app and scan it (scanning codes are on the pillars by the rear tables).

For everyone's safety, please follow the guidelines and be respectful of our stewards and their role in keeping the church open.
