THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD - 13 MAY

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

At the latest PPC meeting held on Thursday 6 May, three key priorities were identified and agreed for coming out of lockdown and a return to 'normal service' across the parish. These follow the priorities for parishes set out by the Catholic Diocese of Southwark.

1. Opening the Church for public services and increasing the number of public Masses - see the opening section of '*News & Views*' for confirmed details and timings, and continuing restrictions for private services. Please note that the live streaming of services will continue.

2. Re-establishing live meetings and activities for all the many parish voluntary groups, strictly in accordance with government safety guidelines.

3. Building on existing initiatives for developing Community Spirit, caring for those in need, of all faiths and none, across the parish and our wider community.

Please watch out for further steps in implementing the above priorities in the next few weeks, leading up to and beyond the proposed ending of Government lockdown restrictions from Monday 21 June.

GLOBAL ROSARY MARATHON

During the month of May Pope Francis encourages us to unite and pray the global rosary marathon for the end of the pandemic at Shrines around the world and in the UK: Join the daily live broadcast of the recitation of the Holy Rosary in link-ups with Marian shrines around the world; videos for all international shrines are available from the official channels of the Holy See at 5pm UK time (Vatican News website and their YouTube channel <u>www.vaticannews.va</u>), video links for shrines in the UK are available at 8pm from <u>www.rcdop.org.uk</u>.

SECOND COLLECTION

Next Sunday 16 May is *World Communications Day*; the collection that day supports the work of the Catholic Communications Network (CCN), the media office of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. The CCN seeks to be of service both to the Church and the world in offering professional channels of communication, and provides support for the Bishops of England and Wales and the wider Church in promoting the Gospel through the media on current issues.

With his message for the 55th *World Communications Day* (published, as usual on 23 January, the vigil of the Memorial of St Francis de Sales - patron Saint of authors and journalists) Pope Francis seeks to promote authentic "clear and honest" human communication, he follows the theme "come and see" (Jn 1:46) – Communicating by encountering people as they are. GRIEF TO GRACE - 14 EDGE HILL

The (registered) charity *Grief to Grace* has now leased the building at 14 Edge Hill, the former Loyola House, from the Jesuit Community, for at least the next 3 years to run their programmes of integrated spiritual and psychological healing for sexual and other abuse survivors.

There are opportunities for employment/volunteering at 14 Edge Hill; flexibility, confidentiality and sensitivity are essential. *Grief to Grace* is seeking to employ a suitably qualified and experienced cook/housekeeper (25 hrs/week, plus some over-time) and a PT administrator (initially 17.5 hrs/week) to join the small team running their new Wimbledon retreat facility named 'The Garden Enclosed', commencing July. Volunteer skills (e.g. gardening, DIY) are also needed.

In addition, they would like to enrol prayer partners to support their ministry. Safeguarding is their priority, so their Safe Recruitment protocols require enhanced DBS checks and references for employees and volunteers.
