FIRE SAFETY IN THE CHURCH

If the fire alarm sounds, the building must be evacuated, even if there is no sign of fire. Provided no exits are blocked by fire, the exits should be used as follows:

- \cdot those seated in the north aisle should leave through the sacristy
- \cdot those in the south aisle should leave through the door on the south side of the church, that's Darlston Road side
- \cdot people in the 2 centre aisles should leave through the main entrance at the rear of the church
- and wheel-chair and mobility impaired members of the congregation should exit through the sliding door that leads onto the ramp. All other exits have steps, so if the ramp exit is blocked by fire, they may need assistance to exit the church.

To meet up with family members or friends, you should move to the Fire Assembly Point situated on the lawn outside the Church.

Do not return to the building unless you are authorised to do so.

Comply with any instructions given by Fire Wardens.

Fire extinguishers can be found at various points around the building but do not use them unless you have been trained to do so.

In the event of a fire being discovered you can activate the fire alarm by striking/pushing the glass on one of the fire call points/break glass call points which can be found at all the last exit doors.

It is important to keep calm, and not to panic or run.

SAFETY NOTICE

Would parents please take particular care to keep their children away from lighted candles. Candles can be the cause of the most awful accidents if clothing catches fire.
