Love is the Greatest Gift

To all of us a call or vocation has been extended as God's precious gift to every Christian. This is expressed with great force in today's readings. The praise of love by St Paul in | Cor |2:3|-|3:|3 is a favourite reading that many young people choose for their wedding ceremony. It presents a magnificent ideal of married life. Many of them forget it, unfortunately. A growing number of those marriages end in divorce. God calls us all to greatness

- to the greatness of loving as God loves us. Love is the greatest of the greatest of the gifts that Paul teaches about today. He calls this gift 'a way'. Love is a way of life to which we are all called.

Friends, we all have gifts. But gifts have to be developed, oftentimes by very hard work and practice. Gifts can be buried, and that is tragic, for then the entire family or parish suffers, to say nothing of the one who buries it. "That is why I am reminding you now to fan into a flame the gift that God gave to you..." (2 Timothy 1:6). We thank the Lord for the gift(s) we see in us. God has called each of us to be a lover. God has given us the gift, the power to love. If we bury that gift, fail to develop it by hard work and sacrifice in our daily contacts with others, we doom ourselves to a life of bitterness, frustration, joylessness for ourselves and families, parish, and community. Last Sunday we were told that lesus entered the synagogue in his hometown of Nazareth on the Sabbath as he usually did and announced the start of a new age! Jesus read that wonderful passage from Isaiah to them, then rolled up the scroll announced: "Today these words are coming true even as I speak". It caused quite a commotion. At first, we are told that everyone was pleased with this basic message. Nazareth failed to take its son Jesus to its heart. Nazareth rejected love, and so lesus left his hometown to itself. Human nature has an inbuilt resistance to God that results from original sin. There is some basic rebelliousness within us, a stubborn pride leading to blindness, oppression, and a

death threat spoken of in today's gospel. By myself it is impossible for me to lift myself out of the quicksand of my own selfishness. Jesus has come to join me, to lead me, to save me, and this is the powerful Good News proclaimed in the Nazareth Synagogue. To be full of duty for God and the gospel we need to share the message of Paul together that: "True love is kind, patient, not jealous, does not boast, is not rude...it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope and to endure whatever comes". Lord, give us the grace to always know how to let go of our plans with courage no matter how we evaluate them to be beautiful and great for your greater glory. And may we welcome you generously like Jeremiah and never forget your opening words in Jeremiah: "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you; before you came to birth, I consecrated you". Let us take more seriously the gift of our consecration by God and our duty to let it bear fruit in us and through us to other people.

Merton Citizens is the local chapter of the nation-wide organisation Citizens UK aiming to strengthen civic society and ensure citizens' voices and needs are heard and considered by decision-makers (www.citi zensuk.org). The parish is a founder member of Merton Citizens Alliance (15 local institutions) working towards a common interest.

Following a listening campaign, key issues of concern to local citizens were identified and groups formed to address each one with results such as: supporting refugee families through the government Community Sponsorship scheme; supporting the national Lift the Ban Campaign to allow asylum seekers to work; the Living Wage Campaign has since 2001 won over £1.3 billion of additional wages paid by 7,000 organisations lifting over 260,000 people out of work poverty.
