The Season of Lent

On Ash Wednesday we receive the mark of ashes on our forehead, a mark that distinguishes us publicly as sinners. What we know privately about ourselves we show to the world. In this act we are bearing our soul so that the pretence of selfrighteousness gives way to acknowledging that we have received redemption as a free gift unmerited and completely gratuitous.

Our problem as human beings first, and Christians second, is that we all suffer the shame of our first parents at having rejected God. And indeed, we still tend to choose the way of self-indulgence in following the dictates of the ego rather than submit to the Word of God through the obedience of our faith, preferring darkness to light.

This tension will always be with us; it goes with our constitution as composite beings made-up of body and soul, but also because we suffer a nature which is fallen; one that finds it all too easy to indulge in selfishness rather than seek out truth and goodness by making the continual acts of love demanded by Christ in the gospel.

The tragedy of our condition is that we are made in God's image who is love, and yet we fall short of that love at every turn. The humiliation and shame that this brings is often too hard to face and we fall into living a double life: the spectre of hypocrisy begins to loom large in our dealings with the other: living in interior darkness whilst ostensibly being children of the light.

Tendentious forms of piety that make a public display of devotion and good works to gain social acceptance and praise are symptomatic of this struggle but are forms of religion which are roundly condemned by Our Lord in the gospel.

During Lent we are called upon to perform acts of penance. True penance is performed in recognition of our need for God, so that we can become ever more inclined to deny base instincts in preference to making gratuitous acts of love in seeing and serving God in our neighbour. Penance is the antidote to hypocrisy.

May our penance this Lent never be a cover for living a double life but always the means by which we can gain a greater facility in overcoming ourselves in order to seek the good of the other. Our penance will, thereby, make us true to our nature as sons and daughters of God who is love. When this happens our darkness will be overwhelmed by the light of Christ that will be breaking forth within us. Fr Matthew
