'Leave The Fig Tree One More Year'

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus did not dispute what could have led Pilate to massacre a number of Galileans and mingle their blood with their sacrifices. Jesus did not argue about the reasons why tower of Siloam fill on eighteen people and killed them. These were all concrete historical events that were not into doubt. But a careful reading of the intervention of Jesus shows that he moved decisively away from the judgment of other people. This reasoning potentially behind question of the disciples of Jesus in John 9:2 when they saw a man born blind - 'Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind? It is for this reason that he asked his audience if they think suffered those who



calamities were worse sinners than others.

To help us understand the shift from judgment of others to putting one's own house in order, Jesus used the comparison with a fig tree that was not bearing fruit. This fig tree in a vineyard seems as good as dead. It has grown no fruit for three successive years. The reaction of the owner of the vineyard seems quite reasonable; have the tree cut down because it is only taking up space that could more profitably be used for vines. But the gardener had a different perspective. He looked at the apparently

useless fig tree and he saw that it could still bear fruit. He had a more positive vision of the fig tree, a more hopeful vision. He felt all was not lost; there was still time for the fig tree to come good.

Surely this is how the Lord looks on us during this Lent. God does not just see what we have failed to do in the past, but what we are capable of doing in the future. He looks on us in a merciful, hopeful spirit. And that is how we are to look at each other and, indeed, at every situation in life. Like the gardener, we need to be patient, be prepared to wait, and be able to look under the uncompromising surface to the faint signs of new life that are stirring there.
