

I began my preparation for this week's introduction to the newsletter by reading again the text written for Palm Sunday 2020. I don't know if you can remember what it was like in that first big lock down. I remember the strange events that week where there was no celebration in any church other than the actions of the priest acting alone in the empty church. The theme of that text was one of expectation, and of hope. There was a sense that despite the worst effects of the virus we would get through it and good things would come out of it.

Two years since things, have changed a lot. We are beginning to feel that we have learnt to live with the virus. Many are still affected by the virus but for most it is not proving so debilitating. While our prayers are still for those affected by the virus, and for those who have lost family and friends to the virus, for the majority there is hope that life is manageable.

Having said that we have moved from one crisis to



another. Sadly, our television screens are filled with the pictures of the destroyed towns and cities of the Ukraine. We witness the pain and suffering of the families left homeless after the bombing and of families torn apart by the conflict. As yet the ears of the aggressor are closed to the pleas for peace. We can only continue to pray for peace and for the hearts of the violent to be opened to the cries of the innocent. This short reflection offers us the context of our coming week when with Christ we walk the path of the passion. From his triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday when Jesus is welcomed as the Messiah to his passion

and death on Calvary, we accompany Jesus on his long and painful journey. We are invited to witness his entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. On Maundy Thursday we share the intimacy of the apostle's celebration of the Passover meal in which we witness the institution of the Eucharist and the gift of ordination to the apostles.. It is then his arrest and imprisonment and torture at the hands of the Romans that we are called on to witness. His ultimate death on the cross on Good Friday afternoon is his great act of sacrifice and of salvation. This is the cost of our redemption. The silence of the grave on Holy Saturday gives way to the joys of the promised Resurrection celebrated on Easter Day. On that day we can with great hope acclaim that we are the Easter People and Alleluia is our song. As we move from death to life on Easter Day so with hope we will move from death to life in the Ukrainian conflict.
