


WHAT IS PALM SUNDAY?

THE PASSION


On Palm Sunday we have two Gospel readings. The second is called the Passion and details the events of Jesus suffering.

When can you pray with Jesus today?




- SENTENCED...



Jesus was taken before Caiaphas the High Priest and the elders. Caiaphas got angry and asked Jesus if he was the Son of God. Jesus replied, 'it is you who have said I am.' With this, the High Priest arrested Jesus for blasphemy.

On Good Friday Jesus suffered a lot because of the Roman Soldiers. They made him wear a crown of thorns and he had to carry the heavy cross through the streets of Jerusalem. On Palm Sunday he had come through Jerusalem in glory.

When Jesus was placed on the cross they placed a sign that said, 'Jesus, King of the Jews'. The crowd mocked Jesus and shouted at him, 'If you are the Son of God, why doesn't God rescue you now!' Write down some of the things that happened on Good Friday.
