# **Our Easter Faith Cannot But Be Proclaimed**

The Resurrection is an event which was obviously not photographed, and there was nobody there to witness this event as it happened; how it happened remains part of the mystery and intimacy that exists between Jesus and God the Father.

The appearance narratives, so called because these stories relate the various circumstances in which Jesus appeared to his disciples after the Resurrection, differ in ways which enrich our understanding of the mystery which lies at the heart of our salvation.

The devotion shown by Mary Magdalene, who goes to the tomb while it is still dark, is rewarded with the first appearance of Jesus. Her devotion turns to zeal once she is affirmed in her faith that He is risen. Jesus then commissions her to proclaim this news to the apostles. Our Easter faith cannot but be proclaimed, "He is risen!"

Mary is at once both a contemplative and an evangelist. A great lover of Jesus who simply desires to be with the beloved but compelled by the same love to share her encounter with others. Do we experience the same compulsion?

The appearances narratives of Jesus to the apostles always emphasise their lack of belief. Jesus almost has to cajole them into trusting their senses, that His body is real and that their eyes are not deceiving them. He is not a ghost, and to prove it He asks them for a piece of cooked fish to eat before their eyes.

Their coming to faith in the Resurrection is gradual, and the lack of faith in Thomas demonstrates the necessity of direct bodily contact which moves beyond a merely spiritual understanding of the risen Christ. His proclamation of faith, "*my Lord and my God*", is testament to the compelling reality of a human nature being transformed by union with the divine.

Jesus is risen with his body, the same body that was crucified, and he remains a divine person. The act of touching the physical wounds of Jesus brings home the stark truth that the human body is not destined to corruption but called to divine life in the same way that the human soul is. The resurrection eliminates the fear of death and inspires a supernatural hope in the future. Do we nourish the same hope, and do we live free from fear in the sure and certain hope in Christs victory over death? Developing a strong bond with Christ through prayer is the way to eliminate fear through a stronger faith in his  $\rightarrow$

Peter's confession at being asked three times by the risen Jesus, "do you love me" results in his being chosen, not for his strengths but precisely because of his former weakness; to now confirm his brothers and sisters in their faith in Christs body the Church: His risen body is now present in the Eucharist and in each one of us who unite with Him by receiving Holy Communion.

The Church, being made up of human beings, struggles with the challenges of the gospel the challenge to love as Christ loved. The struggle, however, is part of the process in our coming to faith in the power of Risen Christ to transform, strengthen and empower us through His Eucharistic presence and the sacramental life of grace. He is the one who transfigures us, and He awaits our personal resurrection as individual members of his resurrected body through the Church. We have only to believe in Him, desire his Will for us and share in His mission of salvation by proclaiming the gospel, thereby creating a civilisation of love - a prefigurement of life in heaven. In fact, by enacting the works of love demanded by the gospel we are able to experience, even now, at first hand, the power of His resurrection which animates these mortal bodies of ours making them like his own in glory.
