## **Being Nourished by God**

Factionalism and complacency erodes faith and destroys a spiritual community. The warning coming from the readings this week reminds us that we can lose our faith and spiritual traditions when we bring the spirit of the world into the Church.

Isaiah laments the destruction of Jerusalem. The Israelites on returning from exile wonder at the destruction of all they held dear. The religious traditions embodied by the temple had been lost because of a spiritual complacency which took God's presence for granted, leading away from union with God and gradually to idolatry.

Complacency comes about when we become sufficient to ourselves and the ego asserts its influence by furthering its own interests in order to gain autonomy and independence from moral and spiritual authority. The Israelites by becoming a great nation, based on their long standing religious tradition, having God at their head, lost everything by idolising progress and wealth over and against God - the very source of their success.

When writing to the Galatians, a Christian community split by factionalism between Jews and Greeks, Paul condemns the complacency of Jewish Christians who claim spiritual supremacy over their Greek counterparts by professing that they are of the true stock of Abraham in virtue of circumcision. Their aim was to establish a pecking order within the Church which makes Greek Christians second class citizens.

In a corrective to this worldly view of the Church, Paul exhorts them to boast of nothing apart from the cross of Christ.

By His cross Jesus inverts the values which govern the affairs of this world. Instead of asserting influence and control by dint of power derived from money, job title or social status, he upholds self sacrifice and the service of the poor and marginalised as the mark of true strength and the source of genuine spiritual riches. To be a Christian means to be crucified to the spirit of this world in order to live for God.

Let us remind ourselves that we are first and foremost Christians and that our social status due to wealth, our career or family history means little before God, and, indeed, can be an encumbrance to true spiritual development by becoming a poor substitute for God. Our prayer life should be that source of spiritual nourishment which leaves us truly satisfied: being nourished by God as a mother suckles her child, as Isaiah so beautifully describes. To wonder at the presence of God before the Blessed Sacrament is the reason for our unity as a community. *Continued on page 2*

"I watched Satan fall from heaven" was lesus' reply to the apostles who rejoiced at being given spiritual power unclean spirits. Pride over comes before a fall as we say, and even our spiritual roles in the Church or as family members at home can become an occasion for pride and a tendency to dominate. Jesus would rather we rejoiced at being on our way to heaven by acting out of a spirit of service in obedience to His command to "love one another".

Our parish feast day celebrations were an occasion to exhibit so much diversity in a range of parish activities on display but with the single purpose of service - seeing and serving Christ in the other whilst enjoying the company of fellow parishioners over a glass or two and some tasty morsels. ### **POPE FRANCIS'** PRAYER INTENTION

Pope Francis has asked the Catholic Church to pray in a special way for the elderly during the month of July. The prayer intention follows requests to pray for families in June and for young people in May and coincides with the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly on July 24: "We cannot speak about family without talking about the importance of the elderly among us, [...] We elderly people often have a special sensitivity for care, for reflection, and affection, [...] We are, or we can become, teachers of tenderness." Pope Francis said in a video message released June 30.

'Let us pray for the elderly, who represent the roots and memory of a people, that their experience and wisdom will help those who are younger to look to the future with hope and responsibility.'
