A Happy and Holy Christmas to you all!

Each of us is blessed this Christmas time as we celebrate again the birth of the child Jesus in Bethlehem. It is a timeless story, it is a story shared by every family as they welcome a new born into their family. Our new-born children are among the most vulnerable members of our families.

We witness their vulnerability when we read of the dangers that can challenge them in the early days of their lives, the risk of drowning as the family

attempts a crossing of the English Channel in an open dingy, or the trauma of surviving a Russian attack on an Ukrainian city.

For most of us the first few months of our children's lives are marked by love and care. We can extend the care of those children in need by supporting those far less secure than we are.

Our Crib Collection this year is in support of charities that are working to alleviate the poverty of the refugees. Care4Calais has been working with France, Belgium and the UK. They aim to meet the needs of those living without money, rights or freedom of choice while waiting for a decision from the Government about their status. Our donation to Care4Calais will be to help extend the services offered to what are the most vulnerable in our society today.

LONDON JESUIT CENTRE

Race and Theology: a course starting on Tue 24 Jan - Tue 21 Feb, 7-8pm: throughout the long history of the Church, Christian sacred texts have been used as a way of promoting both racial justice and racial discrimination. During the earliest period of European colonial history, Christian theology was co-opted by those who sought to provide an ethical warrant for genocide. It was also used by those who

sought to defend the dignity of indigenous people. During the 19th century, Christian theology was used by those who wished to defend the practice of slavery but also by abolitionists. In the 20th century, white nationalist vaunted groups Christian identity, but Christian thought and texts were also used by those who fought against racism. This course explores the complex interaction between Christian theology and race over the course of 2000

Crib Appeal 2022 • Crib Appeal

This year's Parish Crib Appeal will be in support of **Care4Calais**, a volunteer run charity working with refugees in France, Belgium and the UK.

Their local team have been active since July 2020 and they have worked directly with those that arrive here searching for safety. Their services aim to meet the needs of those living without money, rights, or freedom of choice while waiting for a decision from the government about their status. After making an often-dangerous journey to the UK, 37000 individuals are currently restricted to their hotel rooms, with little ability to make decisions due to financial restraints and restrictions.

Imagine waking up every day not knowing if you will be moved and made homeless or taken to a deportation centre and sent to Rwanda. Unable to provide for your children, in some hotels a person may receive just £8 per week, to cover everything other than basic meals.

Support from charities is the only way these people can get through the months or even years of waiting to be granted asylum.

Care4Calais has been overwhelmed with support from the local community, including donations in kind from the Sacred Heart parish.

They now provide additional food, clothing and activities that enhance mental health and wellbeing. They run board game nights, conversation classes, walking groups, yoga classes, cooking sessions and reading with children.

They ask now for your support to allow a little bit of happiness for refugees this Christmas.

They would not be able to do all this without your kindness and generosity, so thank you from the beneficiaries and from **Care4Calais**.

SAFEGUARDING
