Newsletter

A New Vision

In our gospel reading this Sunday we learn from Matthew how Jesus came to complete, to fulfil, rather than abolish, the teaching in the Old Testament - both the Law in the Pentateuch (the first five books) and the teachings of the Prophets. That Law was and still is regarded by the Jewish people as a gift from God, and its observance a response to the Covenant, not a burden. The context of this part of Jesus's great Sermon on the Mount was a debate within Judaism at that time about the correct interpretation of the Torah, and, at the time when Matthew was writing, criticism by the official Jewish leadership of Jesus's teachings as destroying what was fundamental in Judaism.

Matthew records a series of "antitheses" adopted by Jesus for his followers (a standard rabbinical practice) - "You have learnt how it was said, but I say this to you". Jesus speaks with authority and at the end of the Sermon on the Mount his audience show their recognition of that. Jesus goes to the root of the commands; he sharpens them. As in the Beatitudes, he focuses on dispositions. Thus, anger is very often the cause of murder, so avoid it. Do not insult people, stoking up your own contempt and provoking violent reaction. "Brother" here has a wider meaning than biological sibling. Reconciliation is more important than sacrifice.

A lustful look is the first step towards adultery, at that time defined as sexual relations between a married or engaged woman and a man other than her husband; and the look may also lead to breach of the ninth commandment. So, it is better to lose the offending eye than to be tempted into adultery.

At that time there was a rabbinical dispute about the grounds on which a man could divorce his wife, one rabbi in the more liberal school permitting it merely if the wife had spoiled a dish, she had made for him, the other school restricting it to where there had been sexual misconduct. Jesus, however, prohibits divorce altogether (subject to one exception, the meaning of which is still debated). The fourth "antithesis" is against using oaths at all. Jesus demands a truthfulness

that makes oaths unnecessary. These antitheses all deal with important and perennial topics. We shall hear more
