# Laetare Sunday

This year, on Laetare Sunday, we hear a dramatic account of Jesus' cure of the beggar who had been born blind. The story parallels our own developing belief in, trust in, and knowledge of God, perhaps in opposition to the culture that surrounds us. The man comes to see the light in Jesus, physically and spiritually.

Jesus has already described himself as 'the Light of the World'. It is Jesus who approaches the blind man. The blind man is chosen by



Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

God to display his healing work. The man is so changed that the neighbours find it hard to recognise him. They take him to the Pharisees. The Pharisees realise that it had been a sabbath day when the blind man was cured, and they are sceptical: 'How can a man of God cure people on the sabbath?'. They end up chasing him away. We can see that as the Pharisees become sceptical and threatening the once-blind man becomes more confident and assertive in expressing and developing his faith in Jesus. The blind man comes to realise who Jesus is. When first asked who cured him, he says 'the man called Jesus'. When Jesus is then criticised for curing him on the sabbath he says Jesus is a prophet. He then says Jesus is a man sent from God, after which he is driven away. Hearing of this, lesus goes looking for him and asks him if he believes in the "Son of Man". Jesus has been using this term to refer to his role in making God known in the human story. The man replies: 'Lord, I believe', and worships him. Our own adult faith can grow, perhaps more gradually than the once-blind man's, as we get to know Jesus better and have more experience of how he works in our lives, of how he takes the initiative if we are open to him, of how he enlightens us as to what God wants for us - wants us to do and be. In the prayer after Communion we shall ask God to enlighten everyone who comes into this world, illuminate our hearts with the splendour of his grace, that we may always ponder what is worthy and pleasing to him and love him sincerely.
