The Most Holy Trinity

Our hearts are restless until they rest in thee, O Lord. Thus wrote St Augustine. This restless yearning stems from a nostalgia for relationship and intimacy with God which had been lost by our first parents who decided to live outside the realms of that relationship.

Jesus revealed a deep level of intimacy between Himself and one he called his Father. He revealed the nature of God as relationship, a communion of love between three persons. Since we are made in the image of God, and each of us uniquely created as persons are destined to be restored to that relationship with God by Baptism.

Is there any wonder then at our sense of being out of synch with our environment, being estranged from ourselves, and of feeling alienated even from those who are closest to us, when we choose to go our own way?

By maintaining our baptismal promises and deepening our sacramental life, by placing God again at the centre of our lives, we once again experience the peace of homecoming - being at one with God puts us at one with the world and those around us.

As children of God our happiness on earth depends on what the first reading from Proverbs describes as *'delighting in His presence'*, and, in turn, He delights in us at play in his presence. To be caught up in the delightful interplay of love between the persons of the Trinity is what we human beings were created for - God's desire to share his inner world of delight with us human beings is why He created us and, more wonderfully, why he sent his Son to redeem us.

God, in Christ, the second person of the Blessed Trinity was reconciling us to Himself through Jesus - Himself a divine person. In fact, Jesus, in His final prayer to the Father revealed the incredible vocation of us all that we enjoy the same unity with God as He does with the Father: *'that they may be one in us, as you Father are in me and I in thee; so that the world may know that it was you who sent me'* (Jn 17: 20-21). What is more, we deepen that relationship with the Father by living as true disciples of Christ. When addressing the Father, Jesus made it clear that they who by obedience to his word become living temples in which the Trinity makes their permanent dwelling. Jesus tells the disciples in fact, that by enacting what he has told them through his Word the third person of the Trinity will be poured out into them with all His gifts - the Holy Spirit.

We complete God's purpose by presenting Christ to the world by living as *continue on p.2*

LIFE AND LEGACY OF MOTHER MARIA SKOBTSOVA

During Refugee Week, on Friday 23 June from 7-8pm on Zoom, a webinar facilitated by Ben Bano from *Seeking Sanctuary* and Brother Johannes Maertens (missionary-monk of the Monastery of the Good Shepherd and the Catholic Worker movement), will be held to discuss the life and legacy of Mother Maria Skobtsova. Although raised devoutly Orthodox, she experienced a lapse of faith before returning to the Orthodox Faith. She emigrated from Russia to Paris where she became a nun. Working tirelessly to welcome refugees and exiles she established houses of welcome, which after 1940 welcomed Jewish refugees. She was deported to Ravensbrück in 1943 where she died two years later. She has been proclaimed a Saint in the Orthodox Church. Alongside her outreach work she developed a theology of the Cross which is particularly relevant to our welcome of refugees and asylum seekers. 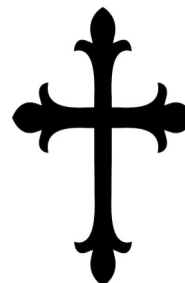
