Welcome and Greetings

With the beginning of the new month of September we welcome and greet everyone!

Surprisingly, today's Gospel has a crucial word for us. While they're on their way up to Jerusalem, Jesus speaks about the painful destiny awaiting him in the capital. His disciples don't understand him. Peter shrinks from those words of Jesus. Peter then takes Jesus aside and starts to remonstrate with him: 'Heaven preserve you, Lord'. 'This must not happen to you'. In response to Peter's comments, Jesus is loud and clear: 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' The development of Peter's thought does not support a giving up attitude. As always with the Gospel it is our attitude that matters.

Not one among them seems to understand that closely following him, working with him, will be a path not of power, success, and greatness, but of sacrifice and the cross. lesus gets them all together and makes his thinking clear. He sums it up this way: 'What then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life?' Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? This is later echoed in the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31).

Like the disciples we shrink even from words like self-denial, mortification, asceticism, and discipline. We run from the cross. The first reading shows that the prophet Jeremiah knew how to accept the reality of his cross (vocation). As today's second reading remarks: 'Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind.'

All the readings, however, raise the standard for us Christians even higher. In our lives we need to find something specific which requires us to go beyond the usual expectations. We know of people who volunteer in hospitals or prisons or with the homeless. We know of people who serve food banks or in charity shops. Others teach English to refugees or assist with the care of young children. They give their time freely and generously in the service of less fortunate. So, it is meant to be with each one of us.

Above all, we welcome our new parish priest, Fr David Gibbons into Sacred Heart Wimbledon. You belong to us...this is your home!

DEFIBRILLATOR

A defibrillator, a life-saving

machine which in the event of an emergency provides an electric shock to the heart of someone in cardiac arrest, has been donated to the parish. The device is lightweight, highly portable and very easy to use. No training is needed to use it because, once opened, it issues clear verbal instructions on what to do. It is located in the Lounge entrance lobby. For interested parishioners there will be the opportunity to learn more in a short 5 mins briefing next weekend after each Sunday Mass.


