Accepting the Message of John the Baptist

It is easy to say we'll do something for someone and then never get around to doing it, or, indeed, to forget about it altogether. It's also easy to say we'll do something (or not do something) without thinking about what it would really involve.

In this Sunday's gospel reading Jesus addresses a parable about two sons to the chief priests and elders (the 'righteous'), who were challenging Jesus' authority.

One of the sons tells his father he will go and work in the vineyard but doesn't. The other says no, but then thinks better of it and does.

message of the coming of God's kingdom and the need for our repentance, to change our lives. The despised tax collectors and prostitutes who did listen and repent were going to enter into the kingdom before the 'righteous'.

Do we sometimes take our Christianity, what we profess, for granted without always considering the depth of its implications - to love God and to love others as much as ourselves, to keep God's commandments, to see Christ in other people and to consider their needs?
