Readings: Malachi 1:14-2:2.8-10 Psalm 130 1Thessalonians 2:7-9.13 Matthew 23:1-12

Children's Liturgy during the 10.00am Mass

TODAY'S MASS

First Reading: the prophet Malachi rebukes the (Old Testament) priests for straying from the true way of God, and thus misleading the people by their false teaching.

Psalm: a very short psalm, expressing a quiet confidence in God. This is a psalm anyone can pray at any time.

Second Reading: St Paul reminds the Christians in Thessalonica how he evangelised them and how they readily accepted the Gospel as God's message. Would St Paul be able to say the same about our community in Wimbledon?

Gospel: Although the scribes and the Pharisees "*occupy the chair of Moses*" (ie they are legitimate religious leaders) Christ criticises them: they do not practise what they preach, they lay impossible burdens on people, they want to attract attention to themselves (rather than to God), and they want to be given honour as teachers (which is what 'rabbi' meant in that era).

Christ is not forbidding us from addressing priests or our biological father as Father, or our school professionals as Teacher, or a medical person as Doctor (which is Latin for 'teacher'), or men as Mister (which is a variation of 'master'). He is using typical exaggeration (hyperbole) to show how sinful and proud the scribes and Pharisees were, not at all humble before God as they should have been.

THIS WEEK

On Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of our Cathedral, St George's in Southwark. On Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Pope's Cathedral, St John Lateran in Rome. This handily encapsulates what we mean by the Catholic Church: that the Catholic Church (in the Church Militant here on earth) exists in two places, the local Church (in our case the Archdiocese, presided over by the Archbishop) and the universal Church (presided over by the Bishop of Rome). This was one of the main strands in the Vatican II document *Lumen Gentium*, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church of 1964.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* §833 states that the Church of Christ exists in the particular church (usually the diocese), which is "*a community of the Christian faithful and sacraments with their bishop ordained in apostolic succession*". Tuesday's Feast

reminds us of this truth, and the Archbishop's apostolic succession is symbolised by his cathedra (his throne in the Cathedral).

The Church also exists in the universal Church; 'Catholic' means 'universal'. "*Particular churches are fully catholic through their communion with one of them, the Church of Rome*" (CCC §834), Thursday's Feast of the Pope's Cathedral – which is St John Lateran and not St Peter's in the Vatican as people often think – reminds us of this truth.
