Third Week in Ordinary Time Vol I, psalter week 3

TODAY'S MASS

First Reading (Jonah 3:1-5.10): The book of *Jonah* is not history or prophecy. It is fictional, a story about a man called Jonah who was called by God to preach repentance to the people of Nineveh, who respond positively. It has a place in the canon of Scripture in order to encourage us to renounce evil behaviour, to fast, and to repent of our sins. This passage is placed in today's Readings to reinforce the first message preached by Jesus - "Repent" - in the *Gospel*.

Let us mean it when we recite the Psalm (24: 4-9. R.v4): "Lord, make me know your ways".

Second Reading (I Corinthians 7:29-31): In the middle of a long passage about marriage and celibacy, St Paul suggests that as Christian disciples we should lead our lives *sub specie aeternitatis*, that is with our eyes fixed on eternity, on the next life rather than this passing life.

Gospel (Mark 1:14-20): This is the first of a series of *Gospels* from Mark. The preacher is spoilt for choice as there are three major themes in such a short reading:

- At the beginning of His public ministry, Jesus' first message is about the closeness of the kingdom of God and the need to repent and believe the Good News;
- · He calls the first of His disciples, who immediately leave their previous lives to follow Him;
- Once called the follower of Christ is to be a 'fisher of men'; in other words the Christian's first responsibility is to evangelize, to spread the Good News.

SUNDAY of the WORD of GOD

The theme this year is Remain in my Word (from John 8.31). "The Word of God is a love letter written for us by Him who knows us like no one else: by reading it, we hear His voice again and receive His message for us" (His Beatitude Pierbattista Cardinal Pizzaballa, Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem). This day is a reminder of the centrality of the Word of God in the life of the Church.

Today we pray for and thank those who proclaim the Word of God in our Parish: not just our Mass Readers but also our Priests and Deacons, our psalmists, cantors and choirs, and Children's Liturgy of the Word catechists. What do YOU do to study the Word of God? Perhaps as a family you can study the previous Sunday's Readings, or you can do so individually, asking the Holy Spirit to guide your meditation on the Scripture.

If you possibly can, please come to Sacred Heart today at 6.30pm for the annual Unity Service, which it is our turn to host. We shall celebrate Vespers, and refreshments in the Lower Hall will follow. You can gain a partial Indulgence by fulfilling the usual conditions (sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the Pope's Intention) and praying the following prayer:

Almighty and eternal God, you gather the scattered sheep and watch over those you have gathered. Look kindly on all who follow Jesus, your Son. You have marked them with the seal of one Baptism; now make them one in the fulness of faith and unite them in the bond of love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
