Tenth Week in Ordinary Time Vol. III psalter week 2

TODAY'S MASS:

First Reading (Gn 3:9-15): There is a common thread in today's Readings of Satan, evil, sin, and division. The First Reading recalls the 'original sin' - of disobedience - of the first man and woman. Somewhat amusingly, the man blames the woman, and the woman blames the serpent. We should not take the details too literally (I have never come across a talking snake): what is important is the disobedience of mankind and our attempt to be like God. To put it another way, this is not history but rather an analysis of our ongoing human tendency to sin and play at being gods.

Psalm (Ps 129 (130) R.v7): If only we are prepared to turn back to God he is ready, in his mercy, to forgive us. Have you been to Confession recently? **Second Reading** (2 Cor 4:13-5:1): St Paul writes this letter to the church in Corinth as he prepares for his third visit to them, as he is concerned about their divisions and disunity. Paul insists that the message he brought them is the true message of Jesus Christ. The reference to our earthly tent is an in-joke: Paul was a tent maker by profession.

Gospel (Mk 3:20-35): Jesus' family think he is 'out of his mind', while the scribes accuse Him of casting out devils through the power of the Devil, or Beelzebub. Jesus refutes this. Why is blasphemy against the Holy Spirit alone of all sins not forgivable? What Jesus is referring to is the deliberate assertion that the Spirit of God working in Jesus is evil, which is equivalent to rejecting lesus. Fr David

NEXT SUNDAY: DAY FOR LIFE

This is the day in the Church's life dedicated to celebrating the sacredness of life. The proceeds from the Second Collection provide core funding for the Anscombe Bioethics Centre and to assist other life related activities supported by the Church, usually by means of grants made to support Catholic charities working in the field of life. This year's theme is The Lord is my shepherd - Compassion and Hope at the end of Life.

End-of-life issues have been in the headlines in recent months with calls for assisted suicide (euphemistically called 'assisted dying') being expressed, especially by celebrities, a view that opposes the Catholic view that life is a gift and that we are called to care for others at the end of their lives. NEWMAN CIRCLE

The next Newman Circle meeting will take place on Tuesday 18th June at 7.30pm in the Parish Lounge. All are welcome when Canon David Gibbons KCHS will talk about the History of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem; Some of you may wonder what the Capital Letters (KCHS) at the end of Canon David's name actually stand for. The answer is "Knight Commander of the Equestrian Order of

the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem" which is one of two equestrian orders recognised and supported by the Holy See. Ecclesiastic Knights are in effect chaplains to the Order which dates to 1099 but was re-founded in 1868 by Pius IX. Later, in 1888 Pope Leo XII extended the Order to include women (Dames) as well as men (Knights)

The main function of the Order is to support the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, which is done mainly by financial assistance and pilgrimages to the Holy Land.

THE YEAR OF JUBILEE 2025

The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, which happens every 25 years. The Papal Bull of Indiction for the Holy Year (Spes Non Confundit - Hope does not disappoint, Rom 5:5) was proclaimed on the Solemnity of the Ascension. The theme is Pilgrims of Hope. This virtue is sourced in the grace of God and His mercy. Thus, the signs of the times, which reflect the yearning of human hearts for God's saving presence, should encourage us to become signs of hope in a world which longs for God, whether it recognises it or not.

A Plenary Indulgence will be available, under the usual conditions, by

- undertaking a pious pilgrimage and visiting sacred Jubilee sites,
- participating in Holy Mass, engaging in Eucharistic Adoration, meditation or other liturgical celebrations at Jubilee sites,
- 3. carrying out acts of charity or mercy, both corporal and spiritual.

You can also obtain the Indulgence by observing penitential practices, such as

abstaining from food or donating to the poor.
