Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

Twenty-Fifth Week in Ordinary Time Vol. III psalter week I

TODAY'S MASS:

First Reading (Ws 2:12.17-20): A description of the ungodly and how they attack believers. This resonates very strongly nowadays with frequent attacks in the mass media and elsewhere on Christians, Moslems and others who have religious beliefs. Psalm (Ps 53:3-6.8): A prayer for help from God when assailed by attacks from the ungodly.

Second Reading (Jm 3:16-4:3): Disunity and disharmony stem from failure to pray properly. How does our parish measure up in this respect?

Gospel (Mk 9:30-37): After the Transfiguration we hear the second prediction of Christ's passion at Capernaum (the first was in last week's Gospel, at Caesarea Philippi) and Christ's teaching on discipleship. 'He sat down' indicates formal teaching by a rabbi. He takes a child: this is an acted parable. Remember that children had a low status in Jesus' time; the point is that the disciple should be humble, like the lowliest person.

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR MIGRANTS & REFUGEES

This Day is an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people of the move, to pray for them as they face many challenges, and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers. The theme chosen by Pope Francis this year is God walks with His people. TUESDAY: OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

The Vatican has agreed to the request from our Bishops' Conference that Our Lady of Walsingham be celebrated as a new Feast in the dioceses of England, starting this year. The Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was established in 1061, according to the text of the Pynson Ballad, when devout noblewoman Richeldis de Faverches asked in prayer for inspiration so that she could carry out a special work in honour of Our Lady. The Pynson Ballad says that Our Lady appeared to Richeldis and showed her in spirit the House of the Annunciation where the Angel greeted Mary in Nazareth and asked her to build a replica in Walsingham as a perpetual memorial of the Annunciation.

BISHOP PHILIP MOGER

Bishop Philip Moger - until now Auxiliary Bishop in this Archdiocese since February 2023-has been appointed as the I0th Bishop of Plymouth by Pope Francis. He will be Installed as Diocesan Bishop on Saturday 9th November at the Cathedral Church of St Mary & St Boniface, Plymouth. He has visited us a couple of times, including for Canon David's Induction and our Confirmation Mass. We thank him for his (all too brief) ministry among us and pray for him in his new apostolate.
