

Today's Mass

66 What do you want me to do for you? →

First Reading: Eucharistic Prayer III asks God to 'gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the earth', and Eucharistic Prayer IV prays for those 'gathered into one body by the Holy Spirit'. This theme of gathering the scattered is taken from today's First Reading from Jeremiah.

Psalm: Today's psalm is a song of joy, sung by those scattered into exile in Babylon but now gathered back in Jerusalem (Zion).

Second Reading: Only the high priest offered the sacrifice for sins on the Day of Atonement. Christ is, in fact, made the true high priest by the Father, and so Christ alone can offer the sacrifice which takes away our sins.

Gospel: The healing of blind Bartimaeus is the last healing miracle in Mark. Notice that Bartimaeus is not initially a disciple of Jesus: he comes to faith after his encounter with Jesus. The Lord's question – 'What do you want me to do for you?" - is perhaps the way we should start in seeking to evangelize and win disciples for Christ. Canon David

Friday: All Saints' Day Holy Day of Obligation

The Solemnity of All Saints is a Holy Day of Obligation, when Catholics should attend Mass if possible. Holy Mass will be celebrated at 6.30pm on Thursday, and at 10.00am, 6.30pm, and 8.00pm on Friday. Please note that there will be no First Friday evening Adoration on this occasion.

2.30pm Friday Friendship Group film screening

The Friendship Group will meet in the Lounge for a film screening of *The Lady in the Van* (2015), starring Dame Maggie Smith, accompanied by ice creams, teas, and biscuits. Everyone is welcome to join.

Saturday: All Souls' Day

Holy Mass of Requiem for all the Faithful Departed will be offered at 8.00am (Latin, in St Ignatius' Chapel), 10.00am, 12 noon (in St Ignatius' Chapel), and 6.30pm. Please note that the Saturday evening Mass, although it fulfils your Sunday obligation, will be a Mass of All Souls, not of the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Plenary Indulgence

A Plenary Indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls, may be gained once in any church either on All Souls' Day, the preceding or following Sunday, or on All Saints' Day, on the usual conditions: recital of the Our Father and Creed in church, sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the Pope's Intention.

Those who visit a cemetery between Fridays 1 and 8 November and pray for the Faithful Departed may obtain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable to the Holy Souls, (and at other times a Partial Indulgence).

2.30pm next Sunday: Blessing of Graves

The customary Blessing of Graves will take place at the Merton & Sutton Cemetery, Garth Road, at 2.30pm next Sunday 3 November.

Altar servers training

The first of two altar server training sessions will be over the weekend of 16/17 November as follows:

- 5.45pm Saturday 16 November (before the 6.30pm Mass)
- 9.15am Sunday 17 November (before the 10.00am Mass)
- 1.05pm Sunday 17 November (after the 12 noon Mass)
- 6.05pm Sunday 17 November (after the 5.00pm Mass)

Each session lasts 30 minutes. Children must have made their First Holy Communion. Just turn up to one of these times: meet in the Sacristy.

Holy Souls in November

If you would like to have your deceased family members remembered in Masses during November, write their names on a piece of paper and put it into the Holy Souls envelopes provided at the back of the church. They will be placed in a box at the altar during Masses in November. Any donations enclosed will go towards Masses for the Holy Souls during the year.

5.30pm Wednesday 13 November Holy Hour for the Dignity of the Human Person

During their November Plenary Assembly, the Bishops of England and Wales will gather for a Holy Hour to pray for the promotion of the dignity of the human person and the culture of life in our countries. This is a response to the assisted suicide legislation currently before the UK Parliament. Can YOU come to Adoration at Sacred Heart Church at the same time, to be united with the bishops in a powerful moment of prayer?

Oppose the Assisted Dying Bill

The Bishops of England & Wales are calling on all Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose assisted suicide (or assisted dying).

Please visit <u>cbcew.org.uk/opposing-assisted-suicide</u> urgently to see how YOU can contact your MP to voice your opposition to assisted suicide being rushed into law. Please make every effort to express your opposition to your MP.

Vincent Cardinal Nichols has summarised the three main reasons for our opposition:

- 1. it is a slippery slope
- 2. a right to die can become a duty to die
- 3. being forgetful of God belittles our humanity.

A spiritual visit to the sick

'I was sick and you visited me' (Matthew 25:36). The Catholic Chaplaincy at St George's Hospital invites those who are willing to join in praying for the sick on Thursday morning in the Chapel. Quiet Adoration begins at 10.30am, with Benediction at 11.30am, followed by Rosary and 12 noon Mass for the patients, staff, students, volunteers, and visitors of St George's.

Major hospitals are a kind of liminal space where heaven comes close to earth as many people face their mortality at the altar of suffering. Here, so many are rightly 'anxious and troubled about many things'. Yet, 'one thing is necessary' still – prayer (cf. Luke 10:41). If you can, of your charity, please consider joining in these mornings of prayer for those in need.

Jesuit Missions' Urgent Lebanon Appeal

Jesuit Missions has launched an appeal to support their longstanding partners in Lebanon. The UN reports that more than 1.2 million people have been displaced and the Lebanese Health Ministry reports that over 2,000 people have been killed, including many children and women, while thousands have fled their homes, seeking refuge in temporary facilities such as schools.

The saints of our church

A challenge to our newsletter readers for All Saints' Day! Can you spot where the following 19 saints and blesseds have their statues in our church? Have we missed any?

Starting easy, can you find **Our Lady of Lourdes** (Mary is foremost among the saints!), **St Mary Magdalene**, and **St John**? What about **St Joseph**?

Next, we have several martyrs of the English Reformation: Bl. Margaret Pole (1473-1541), whom King Henry VIII described as "the holiest woman in England"; St John Houghton OCart (d. 1535), a Carthusian priest; **St Thomas More** (1478–1535), formerly Lord Chancellor; Bl. Thomas Sherwood (d. 1578), a layman; Bl. Thomas Percy (d. 1572), who led the Rising of the North; St Ralph Sherwin (1550-81), the first martyr of the English College in Rome; and St Edmund Campion SJ (1540-81), who wrote pamphlets defending the Catholic faith.

We have some Jesuit saints who died young: **St Stanislaus Kostka SJ** (1550–68) was described by his novice master as "a model and mirror of religious perfection"; **St Aloysius Gonzaga SJ** (1568–91) died while caring for plague victims; and **St John Berchmans SJ** (1599–1621) was noted for his brilliant mind.

Among the founding Jesuits, we have **St Ignatius Loyola SJ** (1491–1556) and his companion **St Francis Xavier SJ** (1506–52), who led the first Christian mission to Japan. **St Francis Borgia SJ** (1510–72) was the third Superior General of the Jesuits.

Finally, **St Alphonsus Rodríguez SJ** (1532–1617) served as a porter at a college in Majorca for 46 years, while **St Peter Claver SJ** (1581–1654) worked with enslaved people in Colombia and is the patron saint of interracial justice.
