Today's Mass



ullet To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding ulletand strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.



First Reading: The essence of the Covenant between God and his people is contained in the historic expression of the Jewish faith, known as the Shema ylsrael ('Listen, O Israel'), which is still part of the daily morning and evening prayer for observant Jews. Fear of God is not servile fear - like a servant grovelling in trepidation at a master's whim – but filial fear: the respect a child should show to a father.

Psalm: In response to the Deuteronomy reading, we sing back: 'I love you, Lord, my strength.'

Second Reading: As usual in readings on Sundays in Ordinary Time, the Second Reading has a different theme from the Gospel and First Reading. This reading, from Hebrews, speaks of God as our one, eternal High Priest.

Gospel: The scribe is close to the Kingdom of God because he grasped that God wants our love more than holocausts (burnt offerings). As Pope Benedict XVI said in his encyclical Deus Caritas Est (2005): 'Since God has loved us, love is now no longer a mere 'command'; it is a response to the gift of love with which God draws us near to him.' Those who visit a cemetery between Fridays 1 and 8 November and pray for the Faithful Departed may obtain a Plenary Indulgence, applicable to the Holy Souls, (and at other times a Partial Indulgence).

This is a response to the assisted suicide legislation currently before the UK Parliament. A new encyclical from Pope Francis dedicated to the Sacred Heart: Dilexit nos (2024)

Pope Francis has issued his fourth encyclical letter, *Dilexit nos*, on the human and divine love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ. While all papal encyclicals are, of course, important, this one is especially significant for us in a parish dedicated to the Sacred Heart. At a moment in history disturbed by so much turmoil and anxiety, Pope Francis invites us to fix our gaze on the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to find there the source of living water that moves us and enables us to reach out to others, to offer forgiveness, to make amends for our failings, and to seek to build healing relationships of faithfulness and service.
