Today's Mass

First Reading: This vision of the end of time and what we would call the Day of Judgement contains the earliest reference in the Old Testament to belief in the resurrection of the dead. The book of Daniel was composed two centuries before Christ.

Psalm: Union with God will prove stronger than death.

Second Reading: Given this text, why do Catholic priests stand at the altar each day offering the sacrifice of the Mass? Because they are offering the one sacrifice of Christ, which alone can forgive sins. They are not offering sacrifices of animals, etc., which 'are quite incapable of taking sins away'.

Gospel: Chapter 13 of Mark is often called the 'Little Apocalypse' as it looks to the end of time. In today's Gospel, using language from the Old Testament (such as today's First Reading from Daniel), Jesus teaches about the coming of the Son of Man, and the need for watchfulness (the parable of the fig tree). That the end will come is certain; but when the Son of Man will return we do not know. Canon David

World Day of the Poor

Today is the eighth World Day of the Poor, with the theme from Sirach 21:5: 'The prayer of the poor rises up to God.'

In his message for the day, Pope Francis reminds us that this year is dedicated to prayer in anticipation of the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025. Christian hope, the theme of the Jubilee Year, is grounded in the certainty that our prayer reaches God's presence, 'not just any prayer but the prayer of the poor.'

These charities are engaged in different ways in tackling the causes of poverty, promoting justice and restoring dignity.
