Advent

We are blest as a new liturgical year begins with Advent, the time when we await the Second Coming of Christ (the theme of the readings at Mass up to 16 December) and then we prepare to celebrate His First Coming (from 17 December onwards).

The colour of vestments is violet, and the Gloria is omitted except for major Feasts. The season is marked by moderation in music, floral decorations, etc.. The Marian anthem Alma Redemptoris Mater is sung during Advent and Christmas until 1 February.

Year of Luke

Not only do we begin the new Lectionary cycle for Sundays, namely the Year of Luke (Year C) - Luke has been described as the 'Gospel of Mercy' - but we also begin using the new translation: readers, please note. See inside for further details. The missalettes have a new format, which has been mandated by the Bishops' Conference.

Today's Mass

First Reading: 'declares the Lord' means that it is God speaking through the prophet. Here, through Jeremiah, God promises that a descendant of David will once again rule Israel, a rule marked by honesty and integrity. Christians have always understood this as referring to Jesus Christ.

Psalm: God is our teacher and saviour. In this psalm, we express our humble trust in and faithfulness to God.

Second Reading: In Advent, we are meant to think about Christ's Second Coming, and use the season to make progress in our spiritual lives. How will you do this? Attend Holy Mass on weekdays more? Set aside more time for family prayer? Undertake some good deed vou don't normally do?

Gospel: Today's Gospel is about maintaining one's faith in the midst of a hostile world: we must 'stay awake at all times' and pray for faithfulness so that we can face Christ with confidence when He comes again. Instead of focusing on shopping lists, ask yourselves: in the end, what does it all mean? How would I live today if I knew it was my last on earth? What truly guides my choices and decisions? What really matters to me? Canon David

New Lectionary

Today we start using the new Lectionary, or more accurately the new translation, taken from the English Standard Version and (for the psalms) the Abbey Edition. We are very grateful to the many people who have donated the cost of the new books, mainly in memory of a loved one. An appropriate bookplate will be placed in the volumes.

Why do we need a new translation? The present translation, from the Jerusalem Bible, is old and since it was written in 1969, there have been developments in scholarship, changes in word usage (who says 'yonder' nowadays?), and many new saints and Feasts added to the Church's calendar (such as Mary, Mother of the Church). It also doesn't have inclusive language, whereas the new version does have gender-neutral language where possible.

The new translation has a more dignified style, considered more suitable for proclaiming the Word of God. Most significantly, the Jerusalem Bible paraphrased more (and so interposed a layer of interpretation), while the ESV is closer to the original language. So, while still comprehensible in English, it aims to reproduce the original author's style (e.g. Mark is clunky and breathless, but Luke is polished Greek). The ESV retains theological terminology – words such as grace, sanctification, and redemption – because of their central importance for Christian doctrine, rather than assuming people won't understand them.

Finally, the Abbey Psalter is a revised and updated edition of the existing Grail Psalter. The main difference is that it restores the lines that the original version omitted to make it easier for choirs to sing.

There are a few changes to the standard ESV for which the bishops asked. For example, in Chronicles 3:1, where King David's wife is 'Abigail the Carmelite' in the ESV, our Lectionary has 'Abigail from Carmel', lest anyone think the King had married a nun!
