

# Today's Mass

**Gaudete Sunday** (named from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon in Latin, which is taken from today's Second Reading) or 'Rejoice Sunday', permits a slight diminution of our Advent discipline, in token of which rose-coloured vestments are worn.

**First Reading:** Beset by personal problems, economic hardships, and anxieties about refugees, terrorism, and war, we can easily become fearful and 'let our hands grow weak'. But rather, we should rejoice and exult, for the Lord will come again: God himself has promised it.

**Psalm:** Unusually, this is not a psalm, but a psalm-like extract from Isaiah, which echoes the First Reading: 'Shout aloud and sing praise.'

**Second Reading:** We should not be anxious about anything, says St Paul, but instead, we should rejoice in the Lord, be reasonable, and show prayer and thanksgiving to the Lord who 'is at hand'.

**Gospel:** Like the other Gospels, Luke portrays St John the Baptist as a forerunner of Jesus Christ ('he who is mightier than I is coming'), but alone of the Gospels, Luke also recounts John's ethical teaching, including sharing resources and food, not extorting money by threats or false accusation, and being content with what one has.

**Exciting news about the Jubilee Year 2025 'For Pilgrims of Hope':** In his decree *Spes non confundit*, the Holy Father calls on all Christians to become 'pilgrims of hope'. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fulness of his mercy. During the Jubilee Year, all the faithful who are truly repentant and free from affection for sin, who are moved by a spirit of charity, who are purified through the Sacrament of Penance, who devoutly participate in Holy Mass, and who pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, will be able to obtain a Plenary Indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins if they visit a Jubilee Church or Shrine. Sacred Heart Wimbledon has been designated by the Archbishop as a Jubilee Church during the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025. This is a marvellous opportunity for you to deepen your faith and hope by coming to Mass and Confession more often in Sacred Heart Church.

**Parking on Christmas Day:** Additional car parking spaces will be available at Wimbledon College from 3.00pm on Tuesday 24 December to 2.00am on Wednesday 25 December.

**Collection at Christmas Masses:** By diocesan rule, the Collection at all Christmas Masses is your gift to the priests of the parish.

Crib Offerings: The Christmas Crib will be displayed in the St Ignatius Chapel. Please take care when lighting votive candles. The Crib Offerings will be sent to the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, earmarked for medical and humanitarian needs, via the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, of which Canon David is a Knight Commander. They will support the humanitarian aid convoys to Gaza, enable the provision of schooling and clinics, and help to rebuild the communities devasted over the last two years in the Holy Land.
