

Today's Mass

First Reading (Isaiah 62:1-5): The prophet Isaiah compares God's relationship with his people to that of a husband with his wife. The Old Testament frequently uses Marriage to explain God's covenant with his people.

Psalm 95(96): Like Isaiah in the First Reading, the psalmist cannot be silent about the wonders God performs for us. Let us too sing heartily 'a new song to the Lord'.

Today's Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:4-11) begins a series of passages from St Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. In this passage, we can infer that the possession of different spiritual gifts led to pride and rivalry in the church at Corinth. Paul stresses that all forms of work and service are the work of the one Holy Spirit, the humbler forms of service no less than the more impressive.

Gospel (John 2:1-11): The first miracle (or 'sign', as John calls it) contains a depth of meaning. 'My hour has not come yet' shows that Jesus always acted in accordance with the Father's plan, not his own. This miracle is a sign of God's overflowing generosity; it is a prefiguration of the Eucharist; it validates our intercessory prayer to Mary, His mother; the replacement of water with wine in the Jewish ritual stone jars symbolises the replacement of the Old Covenant with the New; and it firmly endorses the Sacrament of Holy Matrimonv.

Diocesan audit

The Archdiocesan Finance Office recently audited our Gift Aid and financial records; these parish audits take place every five years.


We are pleased to report that the Independent Examiner certified that both the accounts and accounting records and the Gift Aid recording procedures were in accordance with diocesan requirements. She also stated that 'in general the parish has strong financial control'.

The Examiner identified a few minor improvements, mainly on the part of the Archdiocese Finance Office, and also to help streamline the demanding and complex requirements of recording our finances.

Safeguarding: It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger.
