Fitting the Jubilee Year for Pilgrims of Hope, Pope Francis has chosen as the theme of this year's Sunday of the Word of God 'I hope in your Word' (Psalm 119). It is a cry of hope: man, in a moment of anguish, tribulation, and confusion cries out to God and puts all his hope in Him.

Today's Mass

First Reading (Nehemiah 8:2-6,8-10): After the people return to Jerusalem from exile, Ezra the scribe reads from the Book of the Law while standing on a wooden platform. This would become the way in which the Scriptures were read in the synagogue and how they are proclaimed from the Ambo at Mass. The Word of God is proclaimed from the Ambo: in our church, it is also made of wood.

Psalm 18(19): A psalm of praise of God, of his Word, and of the Law which contains his Word.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:12-30) For Paul, the Church is not merely like a human body: it is Christ's Body. We become members by Baptism. And although we are different parts of the Body of Christ, we are all equally necessary.

Gospel (Luke 1:1-4,4:14-21): In this Year of Luke, we start Gospel readings from Luke, and we hear the beginning of that Gospel. Then we jump to chapter 4, where Jesus, as a rabbi, proclaims the Scripture - a passage from Isaiah 61 foretelling the works of the Messiah - and applies it to Himself. Canon David


After this Sunday, the next Children's Liturgy will be on Sunday 9 February.

Join our parish pilgrimage to Lourdes!

Canon David will conduct a parish pilgrimage to Lourdes from Wednesday 17 to Saturday 20 September. If you have been to Lourdes before, you will want to return; if you have never been, now is your chance to visit this extraordinary shrine in southwest France, where Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette in 1858.

The cost of the three-night pilgrimage is £625 per person for two sharing a room or £730 for a single room. A £250 deposit will be required at booking. The cost includes return flights from Stansted, airport transfers, full-board accommodation at the 4-star Hotel Eliseo, a full programme with daily Mass, travel insurance, a Lourdes prayer book, and the hotel city tax.
