

Today's Mass

Today, we take a break from the Sundays in Ordinary Time and keep the Feast known as Candlemas. Mass begins with a Procession or Solemn Entrance, at which lit candles are blessed and sprinkled with holy water. We recite the canticle *Nunc Dimittis* and its antiphon. The Penitential Act is omitted, and Mass continues with the *Gloria*. Please extinguish your candle when you sit for the Readings.

First Reading (Malachi 3:1-4): The prophet Malachi prophesies about the Lord entering the Temple. His offering will purify the people.

Psalm 23(24) is from an old Hebrew Entrance Liturgy, and expresses in the form of a hymn the entrance of the Lord into the Temple.

Second Reading (Hebrews 2:14–18): The Letter to the Hebrews expresses the deeper meaning of today's Feast, namely that Jesus Christ alone, as a human being but without sin, is the true High Priest, whose sacrifice alone can make atonement for our sins.

Gospel (Luke 2:22–40): In accordance with Jewish Law, Jesus is presented in the Temple. Simeon responds with the canticle we call the *Nunc Dimittis* and Anna responds by praising God. Thus, Jesus is revealed as the light to the nations and as the one who will deliver the people (although the way of suffering is not the way they were expecting). The blessed candles are symbols of Christ, the Light of the World.

Parish pilgrimage to Lourdes

Canon David will conduct a pilgrimage to Lourdes from Wednesday 17 to Saturday 20 September. If you have been to Lourdes before, you will want to return; if you have never been, now is your chance to visit this extraordinary shrine in southwest France, where Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette in 1858.

The cost of the three-night pilgrimage is £625 for two sharing a room or £730 for a single room. A £250 deposit will be required at booking. The cost includes return flights from Stansted, airport transfers. full-board accommodation at the 4-star Hotel Eliseo, a full programme with daily Mass, travel insurance, a Lourdes prayer book, and the hotel city tax.
