

## Today's Mass

**First Reading (Isaiah 6:1-2,3-8):** Isaiah is called to be a prophet. In the process, he has a vision of heaven in which he sees the seraphim make their threefold cry of 'Holy'. This is known as the Trisagion; St John had the same vision in Apocalypse 4, and it is, of course, taken up in the *Sanctus* during the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass.

Psalm 137(138) gives thanks to a faithful and loving God.

**Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:1-11):** St Paul asserts the importance of our Christian belief in the death and resurrection of Christ.

**Gospel (Luke 5:1-11):** Peter's miraculous catch of fish leads to his call to be a disciple, along with his colleagues. It also leads to the famous pun about them becoming 'fishers of men' ('men' here is the Greek word for all humanity, not just males). This has always been taken as a metaphor – a directive, even – for evangelization.





#### Parish pilgrimage to Lourdes

Canon David will conduct a pilgrimage to Lourdes from Wednesday 17 to Saturday 20 September. If you have been to Lourdes before, you will want to return; if you have never been, now is your chance to visit this extraordinary shrine in southwest France, where Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette in 1858.

The cost of the three-night pilgrimage is £625 for two sharing a room or £730 for a single room. A £250 deposit will be required at booking. The cost includes return flights from Stansted, airport transfers, full-board accommodation at the 4-star Hotel Eliseo, a full programme with daily Mass, travel insurance, a Lourdes prayer book, and the hotel city tax. It does not include transport to and from Stansted, which we will arrange.
