# Today's Mass

First Reading (Jeremiah 17:5-8): Jeremiah had the misfortune to tell the truth to those who did not want to hear it. He contrasts two sorts of life. The worldly man is useless: he can't see good when it is staring him in the face and his life is barren. The one who puts his trust in God has a life worth living and produces good things.

Psalm 1(1-4,6): If people follow God's law, it results in their growth and flourishing, becoming fully human.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:12,16-20): Conservative Judaism, like the Sadducees, did not believe in the resurrection from the dead. But Paul's preaching was entirely founded on the fact of Christ's rising from the dead, which St Paul saw as the promise for all believers. If Christ's Resurrection is not real, the whole structure of our faith is a waste of time.

Gospel: St Luke's version of the Beatitudes, more familiar in the version in St Matthew. Traditional Judaism considered the good man's reward was wealth, health, and happiness. Jesus sets out a rather different teaching on discipleship, putting His followers at odds with the wider society and its ideals. The Church is never to feel at home in the world. Canon David
