Today's Mass

First Reading (1 Samuel 26:2,7–9,11–13,22–23): David is fighting King Saul. Although he has Saul at a disadvantage, David refuses to kill the Lord's Anointed King. This story illustrates David's righteous qualities, his moral probity, and his respect for God's precepts.

Psalm 102(103): The Lord – who is compassionate and gracious – is full of mercy when His people fall short.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:45–49): St Paul contrasts the earthly and the divine. Humanity is flawed, like Adam, but God offers us a share in the Divinity of Christ ('the man of heaven').

Gospel (Luke 6:27–38): Jesus' teaching on how to lead virtuous lives can be summed up in one word: compassion. Our goodness should be like God's goodness, the hallmarks of which are love – even love of enemies – doing good, praying for others, giving generously, and being merciful and not judgemental. We would do well to remember always the very wise words of this Gospel: 'And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to them.'
