# Today's Mass

First Reading (Ecclesiasticus 27:5-8): Some pithy sayings collected by Ben Sirach (a century or so before Christ), which chime with the sayings of Jesus Christ in the Gospel.

Psalm 91(92): A psalm of huge confidence in God, built up through prayer and reflection on experience. Plants based on God will still produce fruit even 'when they are old'.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:54-58): In words often chosen for funerals, St Paul tells us that our sin leads to our death, but Christ has decisively won the victory over sin and thus over death.

Gospel (Luke 6:39-45): Jesus lived in a society where people worked the soil to provide food for themselves and their families. In today's Gospel, He uses an image that His audience would have immediately understood: 'For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, for each tree is known by its own fruit.' We might reflect and ask ourselves: 'What fruit do we bear that marks us out as Christians?' Canon David

## 7.00pm First Monday Adoration

Every first Monday of the month until July 2025, Adoration will start promptly after the 6.30pm Mass. This time of community worship will be led by musicians from the Jesuit young adult community at No. 9 Edge Hill.

### **Ash Wednesday**

This Wednesday is the first day of Lent, and a day of obligatory fasting and abstinence.

- Fasting (for those aged 18 to 59) means eating one full meal and two smaller collations that do not equate to a full meal, and avoiding snacks.
- Abstinence (for those aged 14 and above) means not eating meat, including soups and gravies made from meat. It is also good to abstain from things like alcohol on this day.

Fasting and abstinence unite us to Christ's suffering, express our sorrow and contrition for wrong-doing, make reparation for our sins, and help us to grow in holiness.

As the Bishops once wrote: 'No Catholic Christian will lightly excuse himself from so hallowed an obligation on the Wednesday which solemnly opens the Lenten season'.

Holy Mass with the Imposition of Ashes will be at 10.00am, 6.30pm and 8.00pm. Parishioners are also welcome to attend Holy Mass at 9.00am at Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School (Burlington Road, KT3 4ND).

# Lent

Lent is the principal season of penance. As the People of God, we are called to make this season a period of special penitential observance.

Ash Wednesday has an obligation to fast and abstain from meat. For the other weekdays of Lent, the Bishops strongly recommend participation in daily Mass, as well as other devotions such as Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Rosary, and Stations of the Cross.

Let us also in this season witness to our love and imitation of Christ by our good deeds, such as visiting the sick.

So, can YOU attend Mass on weekdays? Can YOU attend a period of Adoration? When will YOU make your Confession? Which of our Lenten programmes will YOU attend? What almsgiving will YOU make?

Lent is the time when we should make a special effort to deepen our practice of the Faith. The time now commences for fulfilling the precept of Easter Communion.

During Lent, purple vestments are worn (purple is the colour of preparation, and Lent is preparation for Easter); the Gloria is not sung except on Feasts and Solemnities; the Altar is not decorated with flowers; and the Alleluia is never sung.

# Statement from Bishop Philip Moger

"At the beginning of November 2024, just before I was to begin my ministry in Plymouth, I let it be known that concerns of a personal nature had been raised, to which I had to attend immediately. This has taken longer anticipated. ΑII things than considered, I have come to the decision to present to the Holy Father a request to step down from my appointment as Bishop of the Diocese of Plymouth. The Holy Father has accepted my request. For immediate future, I will be taking a sabbatical: a time of prayer and personal reflection, the next stage on the journey of my ministry. I realise, with regret, that this leaves a continuing vacancy in the Diocese of Plymouth. I assure the lay faithful, clergy and religious of the Diocese of my good wishes and prayers, and ask the same of them for me."
