Today's Mass

First Reading (Genesis 15:5-12,17-18): God enters into a covenant with Abram, the man of faith. It is a very early direct encounter of a man with God.

Psalm 26(27) is a psalm of confident faith and trust in God. The Greek word 'psalm' actually means 'instrumental music'; the words are what is sung to accompany the music.

Second Reading (Philippians 3:17-4:1): Some people make earthly things like food their god. But if we remain faithful to Christ, He will transfigure our bodies into copies of His glorious body.

Gospel (Luke 9:28-36): As Luke says, the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain is a prayer event; it shows visibly what happens when Jesus prays to his Father: His being becomes one with the Father as He becomes 'light from light'. (The same thing happened to Moses when he talked to God on Mount Sinai in Exodus 34.) Secondly, while the white garment and the voice of the Father look back to Christ's Baptism, the reference to Moses and Elijah speaking of what Christ was to accomplish in Jerusalem points forward to the Cross (which will, paradoxically, be the moment of His exaltation or glorification). This Second Collection enables the Archbishop to make grants to some of our Archdiocese's poorer parishes.

5.00pm Mass next Sunday 23 March First Scrutiny

The First Scrutiny for those on our parish's RCIA programme will take place at the 5.00pm Mass next Sunday and the following two Sundays. The Mass of the Scrutiny outranks a Sunday of Lent, and so the prayers at Mass will be from the Mass of the First Scrutiny, not from the Third Sunday of Lent, and the readings will be from Year A, not Year C.


