Year of Jubilee 2025 • Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday)

Fourth Week of Lent • Vol. I, Psalter Week IV

5.00pm Mass: The Second Scrutiny

The Prayers at the 5.00pm Mass are from the Mass of the Second Scrutiny, and the Readings are from Year A.

The Gospel (John 9:1-41) enlightens the elect who have their second Scrutiny today. Jesus heals the man born blind and, after an altercation with the Pharisees, the man comes to believe that Jesus is the Lord. It takes a bit of time for him. to arrive at this belief: likewise, those on the RCIA course must take time to come to full belief in Jesus Christ. The theme of light is also in many of today's prayers and antiphons. The Second Reading (Ephesians 5:8-14) says that those who are Baptized should 'be like children of the light'.

First Reading (1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13): Samuel anoints David as king of Israel. But notice that it is God who chooses David. Psalm 23(24) picks up references to shepherds (as David was), being guided by God (as David was), being anointed as the chosen one (as David was), and eternal life (as David presumably enjoys). David is a foreshadowing of Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, the leader of His people, the Anointed One (the Messiah), and the giver of eternal life.

Today's Mass (all other Masses)

First Reading (Joshua 5:9-12): Having returned to the Promised Land after the Exodus, the Israelites celebrate their first Passover in the land, and the manna from heaven which they needed for sustenance on their pilgrimage through the wilderness - ceases. When we go to heaven, we will enjoy the eternal banquet there and no longer need Holy Communion for nourishment on our journey.

Psalm 33(34): The refrain 'taste and see that the Lord is good' has long been used during the Liturgy as a reference to Holy Communion.

Second Reading (2 Corinthians 5:17-21): God reconciled us to himself through Jesus Christ, and we are called to hand on that reconciliation to others.

Gospel (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32): The parable of mercy par excellence. Although it is commonly called the parable of the prodigal son, perhaps a better name would be the parable of the merciful father, because the father's mercy - astonishing and unlimited - is the central point of the parable.
