5.00pm Mass: The Third Scrutiny

The Prayers at the 5.00pm Mass are from the Mass of the Third Scrutiny, and the Readings are from Year A.

The Gospel (John 4:5-42), on the raising of Lazarus, is chosen with the elect in mind. Its themes are important not only for the elect on their spiritual journey to Baptism, but also for us all on our Lenten spiritual journey. We see Jesus' human side: He loves Lazarus and his sisters, and He is so distressed that He weeps. We see His power over death as He brings Lazarus back to life. We see Martha's response when Jesus says 'I am the resurrection and the life', and she confesses Him as the Christ, the Messiah. We see Jesus' intimate relationship with the Father, and we see how many came to believe in Him as a result of what they witnessed.

In the First Reading (Exodus 17:3-7), the prophet Ezekiel foretells the general resurrection of the faithful. In the Second Reading (Romans 5:1-2, 5-8), St Paul says that the Spirit which resurrected Jesus will raise us also. One of the Church's seven penitential psalms, Psalm 94(95) laments and pleas to God, but trusts God to forgive and redeem us.

Today's Mass (all other Masses)

First Reading (Isaiah 43:16-21): Isaiah recalls the wilderness wandering in Exodus and Numbers, but above all, he looks forward to the future experience of God's saving power.

Psalm 125(126) is a psalm of joy to come and hope in salvation from God.

Second Reading (Philippians 3:8-14): St Paul tells his personal story to emphasise the importance of renouncing self and accepting Christ Jesus as Lord.

Gospel (John 8:1-11): Jesus reacts to the woman caught in adultery. He does not condone adultery ('from now on sin no more'), nor does he condone the woman's condemnation to death. Why not? — because it would prevent her redemption by preventing her repentance. Likewise, we must not drive adulterers and other sinners away, but give them a chance to repent and be reconciled. We must also acknowledge that we are all sinners; none of us is perfect.

10.00am next Saturday 12 April Lent Penitential Service with individual Confessions

The annual Lent Penitential Service will commence with Holy Mass at 10.00am, followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, during which time Confessions will be available, including with visiting priests.

This is the best time to make your Confession before Easter. Canon 989 states that 'all the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year'. There are seven deadly sins: pride, avarice, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth, and each poisons the soul in its own way.

Annual Confession 'continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2042), is an habitual and necessary means of spiritual progress, and helps us to combat the sin of presumption before God's judgment.

Safeguarding: It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger. Next Sunday 13 April is Palm Sunday

The Blessing of Palms comes at the beginning of each Mass, and all Masses begin on time. Ensure that you are present on time if you want your palm blessed!

10.00am Mass: Procession

Please assemble in the church, collecting a palm cross, hymn book, and service booklet. After the Palm Gospel and Blessing of Palms, please follow the Altar party in the Procession. Do join in the singing in the Procession!

All other Masses (including 6.30pm Saturday): Solemn Entrance

Please collect a palm cross, hymn book, and service booklet from inside the church, then assemble by the arch at the Edge Hill entrance, facing the church. After the Palm Gospel and Blessing of Palms, please follow the Altar party into the church.

From Holy Monday to Holy Wednesday, **Holy Mass** will be at 10.00am and 6.30pm. From Holy Monday to Maundy Thursday, and on Holy Saturday, **Confessions** will be heard from 10.30am to 11.30am and from 6.00pm to 6.20pm.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is at 8.00pm on Maundy Thursday.

The Celebration of the Passion of the Lord is at 3.00pm on Good Friday. Also on Good Friday, Confessions will be heard from 10.30am to 11.30am, and the Stations of the Cross will be prayed at:

- 11.00am (Children)
- 6.15pm (Younger People)
- 7.15pm (Traditional)

The Easter Vigil is at 8.00pm on Holy Saturday. Holy Mass on Easter Sunday is at 8.00am, 10.00am, 12 noon (Solemn Latin), 5.00pm, and 8.00pm.
