Today's Mass

First Reading (Acts 15:1-2,22-29): The Council of Jerusalem – the first universal council of the Church – meets to resolve the problems brought by the influx of non-Jews. It decided that there should be no difference between Jew and Gentile, and that non-Jews need not be circumcised as in the Jewish faith.

Psalm 66(67): As the fifty days of Eastertide continue, we continue to sing our praises of God.

Second Reading (Apocalypse 21:10–14,22–23): In the 'new Jerusalem' (heaven), there is no Temple, because it is filled with God's presence. Likewise, there is no need for sun or moon for light.

Gospel (John 14:23–29): Jesus promises that after He has gone away (that is, at His Ascension), God the Father will send the Holy Spirit to be our helper, our teacher, and our reminder of Christ's teachings. The words at the Communion Rite of Mass – 'Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles 'Peace I leave you, my peace I give you...' – are taken from today's Gospel.

Thursday: The Solemnity of the Ascension

On this Holyday of Obligation, you should attend Holy Mass if you possibly can. The Vigil Mass (with different prayers and antiphons from the Mass of the Day) will be at 6.30pm on Wednesday. On Thursday, Holy Mass will be celebrated at 10.00am, 6.30pm, and 8.00pm.



The Scripture Readings are the same at all Masses. The **First Reading** (Acts 1:1–11) is the familiar description of Jesus being lifted up and taken out of sight as the Apostles looked on. Before this, Jesus tells them that are to be His witnesses. **Psalm 46(47)** chooses itself as the Responsorial Psalm, with the refrain: 'God has gone up with shouts of joy. The Lord goes up with trumpet blast.' The **Second Reading** (Ephesians 1:16–23) tells us that, after His Ascension, Christ is seated at the Father's right hand; this Biblical imagery indicates Christ's position of honour, power, and authority. The **Gospel** (Luke 24:46–53) is the end of Luke and overlaps with the beginning of Acts in the First Reading, also written by Luke.

Vacancy: Be Well Hub Organiser

The parish is looking for a recent graduate to help bring to life its Be Well Hub. The Hub will provide a safe space for parishioners to turn to when their mental health is low or they wish to feel better connected with other parishioners and their local community. Listens, a South London local partnership that includes Merton Citizens and three local mental health NHS trusts, is spearheading the establishment of Be Well Hubs across South London. Fr Jackson, Graham Kennedy, and three other volunteers are leading our Hub's development.

The role, which currently is not funded, will involve confirming the detailed services that the Hub will provide, defining a programme of meetings for the Hub, defining a launch plan, and launching a pilot programme. The role is suitable for a recent graduate with an interest in mental health and with good communication, research, and analytical skills who is looking for work experience. We expect the successful candidate to spend 2 to 3 days per week working on the Hub for around three months.
